POPULARITY AND ADVERTISING

Henry Ford and his new automobile which, incidentally, Henry says is not a fliover, have secured a triumph in publicity which may have established a record for all time. And why?

The answer to the question is simple. Henry Ford always has played his business to the great masses. His ideas of production, labor, wages, working conditions, his hobbies, whims and what not all have been pointed toward general popularity. Much of all of this, however, has been his great advertising campaigns in which he has spent millions and millions. In placing his new automobile on the market yesterday, it is safe to estimate that his outlay for advertising will be near the three-million mark. Every newspaper of any consequence has carried full page advertisements every day this week and previously there have been weeks and weeks of advertising telling prospective buyers that Mr. Ford would manufacture a new car.

Police yesterday were reported to be actually fighting with crowds around the showrooms in the United States and abroad while it was estimated that the first day's sales would be approximately 200,000.

Whether anyone of a different personality than Mr. Ford could have secured such a tremendous success with a similar outlay is a question which must go unanswered for the reason that there are too many conditions to be taken into consideration chief among which is the fact that Mr. Ford has been before the public to no great extent in years other than his automobile business. The fact remains, however, that he has advertised, perhaps until it "hurt," and he has obtained results which will many hundred times offset his expenditures.

Clarification of Present Laws With No Major Changes Is Position of Mentors Who Form Association to Aid in Adjusting Difficulties.

CHICAGO, Dec. 3.—Clarification of the present football rules rather than further complication by changes was asked of the national football rules committee by Big Ten coaches and athletic directors in annual meeting here.

That the midwest gridiron strategists wanted no major changes, however, was clearly indicated by a resolution declaring they would "disfavor any changes in the football rules that would increase the possibilities of technical fouls."

A year of grace before any change becomes effective was also sought in order that they might come to a better agreement on interpretation of the rule. This time would also permit adjustment of style.

The coaches clearly indicated their disfavor with the rules as they now stand by forming a new organization, the Western Conference Football Coaches association, which will meet twice yearly to establish a uniform interpretation for the Big Ten schools.
