RESISTANCE TO DAMAGE BY WHEAT SMUT: After an investigation of the wheat smut from blight or attacking smut of wheat, it seems probable that science will now conquer this fungus disease and make it innocuous, according to a recent announcement by the United States department of agriculture. This is joyful news to the farmers who have cultivated untold millions of bushels of wheat smut.

The department's description of the smut states: This one of the agriculturalist, follows:

"Since 1913 plant breeders in the United States department of agriculture and in state experiment stations have been striving to find means of saving the wheat that are better than chemical treatment of the seed. Chemical treatments are not always successful, in the Pacific coast states where the fungus lives in the soil as well as on the seed.

"Indeed the plant breeders experimented with various strains of wheat planting them under conditions favorable to smut development. Some strains were almost exempt from smut.

"Others were only slightly affected, and these were raised with special care and their seedlings planted in the field. The most desirable hybrids that proved smut free were selected for further propagation.

"An outbreak from Turkey and Florence which is called mildew. This wheat has been tested for smut and is so free from smut that it need not be treated, and about 100 acres have grown in 1925.

"Another outstanding hybrid is Abbot, which descends from White Falcon and Hybrid 128. This has proved not only smut resistant but of superior quality and exceeds the standard varieties grown at the national agricultural experiment station. Mildew is a seed wheat, and Abbot is a winter wheat. Other smut-resistant selections and hybrids are in process of development.

 NEW YORK, Dec. 6.—Professional football is not the "college" collection, according to one of the leading officials of the game who has wide experience officiating both in college and in the pros.

After playing three years of varsity football it would seem that the college player who entered the professional ranks would be much better than in his undergraduate days.

But that is not the case, in the opinion of this particular official, who claims that it takes three years for a college star to develop into a first rate professional player. It takes Grange, Friedman and Novotny as the most notable exceptions to the statement.

"The big first year in pro football the college player is rarely good enough to become a regular," the official said. "The second year he is fair, but he's not quite the third year that he's capable of playing a well rounded game."

1. The professional players do not train as rigidly as the college players and consequently cannot give their best effort.

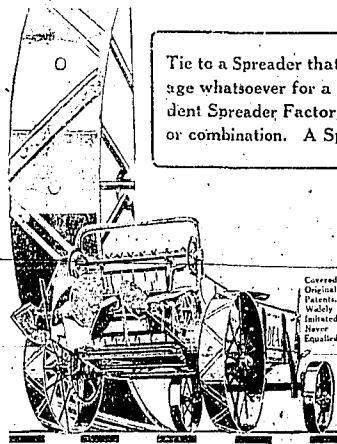

TAX MEASURE IS INTRODUCED ON FIRST DAY

Goes to Committee; Returns to House Friday; Provides 325 Million Cut.

WASHINGTON, Dec. 6.—Introduction of the new tax bill today opened the way for reductions that will benefit business interests and millions of citizens who own automobiles and go to theaters, bathhouses, etc.

The measure, drafted by the ways and means committee, provides for tax reductions of \$25,000,000, but a fight will be made by Democrats to increase this amount. It is predicted the bill will cut taxes at least \$200,000,000 when it reaches the floor for the White House some weeks hence.

Expect Quick Passage.

The bill will be referred today to the committee which drafted it, and will be taken up by the house probably Friday, after issuance of the deficiency bill. Republican leaders predicted the tax bill passage by the house by the end of next week.

Corporations will not see a reduction of \$100,000 under the bill, but a reduction of their tax rate from 12 1/2 to 11 1/2 per cent, and through an increase from \$2,000 to \$3,000 of the exemption on corporations with incomes less than \$25,000.

Theater and Auto Cut.

The automobile tax of a half cent is to be cut to 1/10 cent. The bill introduced today, which means a revenue loss of \$33,000,000. Democrats in the house will fight to have the tax wiped out entirely.

PRO FOOTBALL IS NOT AS GOOD AS COLLEGE BRAND, SAYS EXPERT

By United Press
NEW YORK, Dec. 6.—Professional football is not as good as college football, according to one of the leading officials of the east who has had wide experiences officiating both brands.

After playing three years of varsity football it would mean that the college player who entered the professional ranks would be much better than in his undergraduate days.

But that is not the case, says the opinion of the professional officials, who claim that it takes three years for a college star to develop into a first rate professional player. DeLoe, Grause, Friedman and Weaver are the most notable exceptions to this statement.

"In his first year in pro football the college player is rarely good enough to become a regular," the official said. "His second year he is fair, but it is not until the third year that he is capable of playing at all around game."

This might lead one to believe that pro football is better. But it is the contention of the officials that the New York Giants and perhaps the Cleveland team and the Chicago Bears are the only teams in a class with the best college teams in the east this season.

The reasons for this view are:
1. The professional player is not trained as rigidly as the college player, and consequently cannot give their best efforts.
2. Professional players play individual football while the college game is a team affair.
3. The professional coaches are inferior to the college coaches.
4. The professional player does not have the incentive to win that the college player does.
5. The professional game in which professional players are superior to college players is forward passing.

DeLoe, Grause and Friedman are as dead as accurate and part of their ability to catch the ball that one out of every 10 passes would be complete if the professional interpretation of the pass rule didn't allow interference with the pass receiver, this official said.

The most frequent criticism of the rules in pro football is double, this official has found.

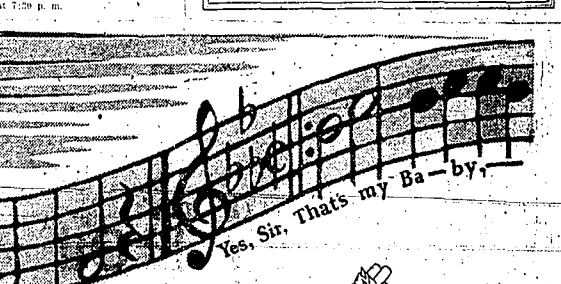

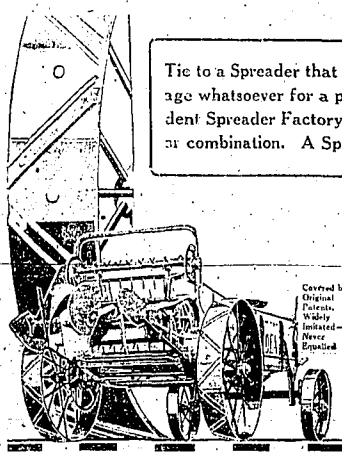
