





## IT'S ALL CLEAR NOW.

President Coolidge yesterday held the center of the stage at Washington on two occasions and, from the fireworks of the first day's session of the seventeenth congress and the meeting of the republican national committee selected two themes of news which undoubtedly are among the most momentous of the year.

The first was the president's message to congress in which he urged relief for the nation's farmers in the way of a federal board to review a relief fund which, at the start, would be financed by the government.

The second was the chief executive's declaration before his party's national committee that he meant exactly what he said last summer when he announced that "he did not propose to be a candidate in 1928."

Regarding the farm relief problem the president said that food and price-fixing was unsound and that he believed that a temporary plan of the movement aiding the cooperative marketing movement until such organizations could assume the full burden would be the most beneficial in the long run.

Mr. Coolidge's farm relief program may be made to work out to the satisfaction of all concerned in the end, but to the layman it does not appear to present a basis of action which will bring relief to the agriculturists without a long period of experimenting and possible resulting failures and disappointment before feasible and stable machinery can be set in motion. The plan undoubtedly has many good points and The Times hopes that if it is adopted by congress it can be made to operate successfully.

Uncertainty regarding the president's farm relief proposal was voiced yesterday by many leaders in Washington, particularly those who constitute the so-called western farm bloc.

While the president's pronouncement regarding the 1928 campaign cannot be presented with absolute clarity, he closed the door on the early leaders of his party to keep, if they did not previously, that Mr. Coolidge does not want the nomination and that he even opposes being drafted. He told the committee in no many words that they should proceed to select another candidate.

Unless the totally unexpected occurs, the republican party will now consider that the chief executive has "buttoned his bridges" and is determined not to accept the nomination thus clearing the way for Lowell, Hoover, Borah and the many others, who, in various ways during the last few months, have thrown their hats into the ring and who now will very likely proceed to follow their headgear into the roped arena even though its planks have not yet been fully selected.

While Idaho is reported to be Senator Borah and capable enough strength for him now is likely to develop the Hoover humanism and leadership which will be demanded, the secretary of commerce has won thousands of friends through his systematic funding of his "Hoover and his Boys" tour during the World War.

In any event both tracks—the one in congress on farm relief and the other leading to the republican presidential nomination—now seem set for fast running and newspapers fresh now until next summer will fairly bubble over with news of developments.



## KID GRIFFO, ONCE BANTAM KING, DISCOVERED DEAD AMID POVERTY

SPRINGFIELD, Ill., Dec. 7.—Kid Griffo, one of the leading bantamweight and lightweight boxers, was found dead in the days when light fighters spent their all on enthusiasm and skill.

He was found dead in a condemned house in the "Hell Kitchen" neighborhood where he had been taken to several years ago after he had been unable to find a place to live. He had left the Bronx late in 1926 and had come to the Bronx by that time.

The boy had earned his living as a bantamweight and middleweight and his death was given as the cause of his death.

Although he had fought at the bantamweight limit in the early nineties, he weighed more than 200 pounds when he died.

Kid Griff, or really Alfred Griff, 18, was an amateur, one of that group of American boys who made such marked success in the country. He made his American debut in Chicago in 1923 and won his first fight.

From then on for several years he

was one of the most popular boxers in the country. While he never held any championships, he met all of the clever men in the light and bantam weight classes.
