

COOLIDGE ASKS FEUR BRINGERS FOR FEDERAL EXPENSES

BUDGET IS 200 MILLIONS OVER PRESENT YEAR

Naval Increase—Major Item in Nation's Great Peace Time Proposed Outlay.

WASHINGTON, Dec. 7.—President Coolidge today presented Congress with America's greatest peace-time budget.

The president requested appropriations of \$458,000,000 for the fiscal year of 1929, or about \$200,000,000 more than the budget for the current fiscal year.

He stressed the importance of a "balanced budget" and warned against raising taxes beyond a certain point, a tax reduction never more than \$25,000,000 might jeopardize our financial stability, he said.

Increased appropriations were requested for national defense. An appropriation of \$52,000,000 was asked for the navy department and \$38,523,143 for the war department.




