OF COURSE, CERTAINLY.

For a few hours yesterday it seemed that Col. Charles A. Lindbergh had made an error and had either missed Mexico entirely or that he had been added to the long list of visitors. Eight visitors. However, Lindy put in an appearance at Mexico City just when a search for him was about to be started, received another of the wild receptions of which he is grown weary, shook hands with members of the U.S. and Will Rogers, who was in the grandstand at Mexican City with President Calles and United States Ambassador to Mexico, and then went to dinner.

Lindbergh's modified time for the 2,100-mile flight from Washington to Mexico City was 27 hours and 13 minutes. During part of that time he was lost, and counting out the period he was wandering around over the Mexican desert, he probably made the trip in approximately 21 to 25 hours.

More than 25,000 people waited with President Calles and the Mexican cabinet for Lindbergh's arrival. About 1 p. m., many became disengaged and left but there was a wild rush for the field when the Spirit of St. Louis came roaring over the horizon shortly after 2 and when it arrived over the field at 2:30, Lindy took nine minutes to pick an opening in the crowd on the field which had broken through the police lines, and came to ground at 2:39 p. m.

The great demonstration for Lindbergh yesterday and those which he will receive in other Mexican cities undoubtedly will be the medium for restoration of full relations between the United States and Mexico. All of the world has a hero and Lindbergh's popular appeal to the always enthusiastic spirit of the Mexicans very likely will cause the citizens of the southern republic to forgive and forget much in connection with the relations of the United States with Mexico.

The German athlete-athletes were not blinded in their opposition to Dr. Otto Peltzer's visit to this country.

Before the noted middle distance runner had so much as set foot upon American soil, he encountered one of those snubs which occasionally enter the lives of the world's greatest athletes, the professionals, with whom good little athletes no longer may associate.

When Peltzer arrived, he was met aboard the North German Lloyd liner by a group of journalists, including one of his own race who identified him as "the German athlete." The doctor, smiling, took his bag from the deck of the Berlin. This was enough, according to the account of other reporters, the German journal 14 promptly offered for sale, saying \$50 to the press.

Now here comes a safe loan made, the finger of suspicion must inevitably point again toward the direction of Dr. Peltzer. Athletes may do many things, but collaborating in the sale of their photographs is felonious.

Realizing the danger, the journalist announced later that he had not agreed to sell the photograph, adding that "anyway, Peltzer knew nothing about it."

Nothing came of the incident, of course, but it was a close shave. It was, to say the least, an unattractive start for the German athlete's American visit.

The question of how long a time he was washed while the drivers went and restored to good standing in any given athletic community has been raised again in France.

Here comes another very good reason why the Olympic Games have been delayed: the sum of money to support a team could come from what interests France is interested in the Davis Cup.

Although well equipped as to cup defenders in the persons of Henri Lacoste, Jean Borotra, Henri Cochet and Jacques Brugnon, the French are going to have to go to the cup which they carried home from the courts of Germainville last fall.

Having an idea that Paul Feret, the young French professional, might possibly come in hand in amateur circles, Lacoste and the other quickies went before the tennis federation and suggested that Feret be declared amateur.

The customary formality in such cases requires an athlete who has lapsed from grace to live five years of penance before regaining his or her amateurism.

"We waive the formality in Feret's case," suggested Lacoste. "He didn't make very much money out of C. C. Pyle, anyway."

But it seems that young Mr. Feret at one time had been guilty of speaking out of turn. Upon accepting a lucrative offer from C. C. Pyle to tour the United States, he said:

"Well, anyway, I'd rather be an amateur professional than a heavy sugar amateur, like some of my friends."

As far as the federation is concerned, Mr. Feret remains an honored professional.




