CHICAGO, Dec. 28.—Javelins, hams, corn, hams, bacon, etc., of yesterday's buyers selling today, was the only feature of today's session on the Chicago board of trade.

There was very little and lack of real weakness, but rather than buying the small decline. Receipts were four cars, while the market was off 14 cents, to \$1.15 at the close.

But weather continued to hold up country marketing of corn, but trade was very slow, and the market closing at 5 cents was very low.

Receipts were 45 cars and cash was unchanged, to the lower.

BURLEY TAXI DRIVER IS MISSING; FIRMS BUILDING SEARCHERS WORK WITHOUT CLUE CHEAPER AUTOS

Last Definite Word of Whereabouts of Jack Terry Was When He Left for Kimberly With Stranger; Car Found West of City.

Jack Terry, Burley taxi driver, was last missing at 2 p.m. this afternoon and the searching party, composed of the sheriff, his deputies, the mayor, and members of the Elks Lodge there, working without any definite clues, was concluding the hunt. The three hours were unproductive.

BURLEY, Dec. 29.—No trace has yet been found of Jack Terry, missing last Saturday. Terry, 26, left this place about 8 o'clock Tuesday evening in company with a man who had hired him to go to Kimberly, a small town 20 miles west of Twin Falls, in an American hotel. Terry, asking for a taxi, the call came Terry at his home. When the car appeared he got in and started off for Kimberly and did not return at once with three or four others. This is the last seen of the party by Burley residents, though they were watching all the time for signs that the car, which bears taxi signs and advertising, had stopped for a change of oil and fuel gas. The car was found about a mile and half east of what is known as the Starch's Ferry church five miles west of Burley. It was standing by the roadside with the keys on the seat. Terry, described as a slender man, six feet tall and weighing about 200 pounds, with dark-brown hair, well defined features and about 35 years, was last seen in Twin Falls in a sheepskin coat and a wool cap and dark trousers. He has been operating a taxi-service about two weeks out of Twin Falls, and is a close friend of Burley and vicinity all his life. He is well known in Twin Falls, and is a brother-in-law of Gene Cull, who operates an orchard north of Kimberly.

Twin Falls Police Suspended. Because of the large part of the police population and the Twin Falls police are now co-operating. No motive for foul play has been suggested since Terry was not carrying any cash or jewels. The car was in possession of the car, so conspicuously marked as an American hotel taxi, would scarcely have been destroyed.

When Terry failed to return home, his wife became alarmed and called for help in locating him.
