

CATTLE MEN TO ATTEND SESSION

Cattle and Horse Growers Will Attend January Meeting of Wool Growers.

Word was received yesterday at the headquarters of the Idaho Wool Growers' Association in Twin Falls, that the cattle and horse growers of the state of Idaho will be glad to accept the invitation of the president of the sheep association, T. C. Olson, to join with the wool growers at their convention in Pocatello, Jan. 15 and 17, according to an announcement made by Donald McLean, secretary.

This will greatly increase the number of delegates expected at the Pocatello convention and will make it one of the outstanding livestock conventions of the west this winter.

The larger part of the wool growers' convention will be given over to the discussion of the subjects of forests, public lands and ranges, the predatory animal question and the rate and transportation and stock yards problems, as well as livestock taxes.

The only subject in which the cattle men would not be as much interested as are the sheep men is in the marketing, the sheep rent of production studies, and a few minor matters.

The cattle men will also join the sheep men in their luncheon and entertainment, and their wives and families will be included in the entertainment that is being planned for the women.

Alvin Campbell of New Meadows, president of the Cattle and Horse Growers association is expected to be present, as well as Ed Williamson of Mackay, its secretary.

BURLEY TAXI DRIVER IS MISSING; SEARCHERS WORK WITHOUT CLUE

Last Definite Word of Whereabouts of Jack Terry Was When He Left for Kimberly With Stranger; Car Found West of City.

Jack Terry, Burley taxi driver, was still missing at 2 p. m. this afternoon and the searching party, consisting of the sheriff's office and police officers and augmented by residents of Burley and members of the Twin Falls Rotary, working for the missing taxi, was continuing the hunt. The Times learned, in communication with the sheriff's office at Burley,

BURLEY, Dec. 29.—No trace has yet been found of Jack Terry, missing taxi driver of Burley, who left this place about 5 o'clock Tuesday evening in company with a man who had hired him to go to Kimberly. The stranger appeared at the American hotel in Burley, taking for a taxi the clerk calling Terry at his home. When the car appeared he stated he wanted to make a trip to Kimberly and return at once with three or four others. This is the last word of the party by Terry's relatives, though a service station at Kimberly reports that the car, which bears taxi and advertising, had stopped there a change of oil and for gas. The car was found later about a mile and a half west of what is known as the Starr's Ferry church five miles west of Burley. It was standing by the roadside with the keys on the seat. The radiator, which had been filled with alcohol, was empty. No signs of violence were to be detected, and a slight fall of snow had obliterated all tracks. The sheriff brought the car into Burley late yesterday afternoon.

Passenger a Stranger. Concerning the passenger, who was a stranger here, the "diamond" messenger, that he was of medium height, rather dark and dressed well. He was blond, wearing a dark suit, the details furnished by the three men who were in the hotel lobby with Terry is that he was about 35 years old, six feet tall and weighed about 200 pounds, with dark brown hair, light colored features and about 25 years old. He was dressed in a sheepskin coat and a wool cap and dark trousers. He has been operating a taxi service about two weeks only, but has been a resident of Burley and vicinity all his life. He is well known in Twin Falls, and is a brother-in-law of Gene Day, who operates an orchard north of Kimberly.

Twin Falls Police Searching. Searchers include a large part of the Burley population and the Twin Falls police are now cooperating. No motive for foul play has been suggested, since he was not carrying any considerable sum of money, the possession of the car, so conspicuously marked by an American hotel taxi, would scarcely have been desired.

When Terry failed to return home, his wife became alarmed and called for help in locating him. The early morning search was well started, but it was not until about 11 a. m. yesterday that the car was found by the roadside five miles from this place. Terry is spoken of as being a man who works much time at his home, and he has voluntarily absented himself is recorded as highly improbable. Being a shy and quiet in good physical condition he would be able, it is stated, to give a good accounting of himself in any situation. If he has not foul play, he has been fitted against greater numbers, or names of books, or both. He is not known to have carried arms.
