### Fire Ruins Fall River Business Area

#### MASSACHUSETTS CITY VISITED BY TERRIBLE CONFLAGRATION; RECONSTRUCTION UNDER WAY

Property Damage Put at \$25,000,000; Over 200 Buildings  
Destroyed; Structures of Historic Interest  
Met As Flames Spread.

FALL RIVER, Mass., Feb. 3.—The last shubers of the \$25,000,000 fire which swept Fall River's business and industrial district during the night had scarcely been extinguished this afternoon when business men began work on a program of reconstruction.

Twelve persons, including five citizens, were injured seriously and 250 persons were treated for minor injuries.

More than 20 buildings were destroyed.

Included in this list were the great Farnell Mills, the Hiltz theater, the Hotel Malabar, the Standard Oil plant, the bus terminal, numerous smaller structures.

The "miracle block" on Main street was closed to the public and was used to catch the full force of the flames. The block had been erected by the city to help the theater.

Then the fire, helped by the strong wind and the cold weather, spread to the Hiltz theater, forced the regular moviegoers from the seat of Great Britain's western empire to make their homes in Fall River.

Field Marshal Haig Is Laid to Rest in Famous Abbey.

LONDON, Feb. 3.—Sir John Haig, war-champion in chief of the British army in France, as an elderly man, died yesterday.

Hundreds of thousands joined the long road by which the general's casket and one-half million people marched to his funeral.

He had been buried in the Abbey of St. George, in the cathedral of Canterbury, England, where he had been buried in 1922.

Then the body was moved to the Abbey of Westminster, London, where it lay in state for two days.

Only the white British corps, but the allied countries with whose army leaders, Field Marshals Haig and French General Joffre, marched through the year, joined the funeral ceremony.

Private services were held in the cathedral of Canterbury, and a public service was held in the cathedral of Westminster.

An impressive service was held with the singing by the congregation of "Forward, Christian Soldiers," and the organ playing of "Nearer My God to Thee."

When the service was over, the body was taken to Waterloo railway station to be sent to Scotland for burial in the family vault.

## OUR FOR HOOVER

The Scranton-Howard newspapers have come out in the open in advocacy of the candidacy of Herbert Hoover as the Republican candidate for president of the United States and for Al Smith on the democratic end of the contest.

## A SEVERE INDICTMENT

The state department of agriculture, which with other state and private agencies is seeking a solution of the potato marketing problem, has a severe indictment against dealers throughout the state and in the Idaho Falls district.

A fieldman is being shipped from this section in great quantities and in bags labeled "Idaho Selected," "Idaho Mountain Grown," "Idaho Selected," and "Idaho Fancy Grade." If the statement is true, and local dealers and shippers claim that it is true, the case for the indictment has been found.

The statement was made publicly by Boise recently by a prominent Idaho grower of raised Idaho. That "dishonest dealers who desire to speculate are the cause of the present trouble." The statement was followed up with another to the effect that "with Idaho potatoes sent under a graded name and brand of high quality did not possess of speculation for the reason that anyone can sell a guaranteed article but if takes a "smart" dealer to sell an inferior article for a high price and in that way make money in the production."

It is this "smart" dealer who has contributed the most to ruining the good name and market for a legitimate product that has been built up for years by the legions of growers of the valley. It is this "smart" dealer who is not satisfied with a legitimate profit and who looks to make a quick fortune even earlier than potatoes than the man who spent the greater part of the year in the production.

It is this selfsame "smart" dealer who has prostituted his selfish profit an industry and product that had built a reputation which could have been sustained had a profitable venture for all concerned.

The latter, unprincipled and uncleaned for attack on the deportment of agriculture of the state, couched in the language which it is fit for its place, has broken right loose the cause and effect of the present condition of the market. The dealers will not soon forget the action of the "smart" dealers who have brought this to all through their evasion of a regulation in order that they might selfishly profit. The resolution had come and it is now that the responsibility has been fixed upon those in charge of the real situation which know—Idaho Falls Times Register.
