





### Argentinian Gives Books to Germany

Dr. Ernesto Quesada himself received his higher education in Germany. He is now in the United States where he studied history under the late Professor Lamprecht. Subsequently he was appointed attorney general of the Argentine and professor of political economy at the University of Buenos Aires. He has a distinction as the author of more than 100 scientific works.

The University of Chicago, as well as other educational institutions, are reported to have offered large sums for Professor Quesada's Argentine government as a gift on condition that the library of the University of Buenos Aires be transferred to the Argentine as the centerpiece of a South American institute in Berlin.

The Argentine government offered the Argentine navy a professorial chair at the University of Berlin. It is believed that Professor Quesada will accept this offer, although he will continue to give occasional lectures here, as his health forbids the rigors of regular professional activity. He is expected to take up his residence in Switzerland.

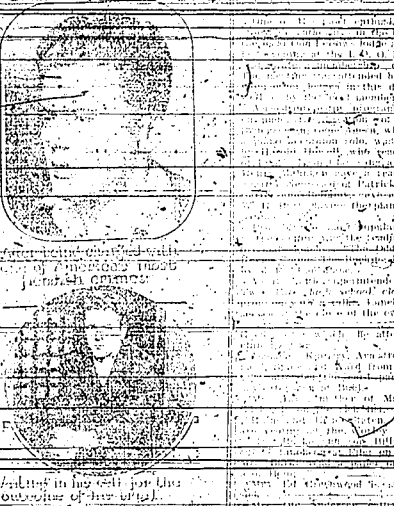
