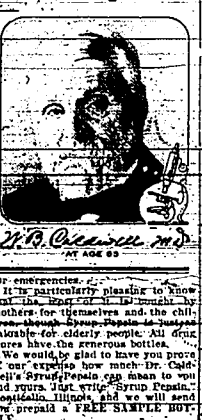

PLANNING FOR FUTURE HIGHWAY TRANSPORTATION

No factor in the economic development of these United States is more vital than that of highway construction. These states having the most extensive highway facilities are those states enjoying the greatest measure of prosperity.

The people of this country have long ago passed that stage in which argument is necessary. It is now merely a matter of ability to perform. We have learned the value of solid roads; we have seen first-hand the advantages of a well planned and maintained highway system.

Today the problem is one of adequate increase of highway facilities. In the more densely populated areas of the country the old type of narrow road has not only become obsolete but actually dangerous, to such an extent that it has become a serious hazard.

Commenting on this factor of providing necessary funds to meet the increasing highway transportation demands of the day, the Record-Herald of Helena, Montana, has this to say:

In New Jersey a plan for super-highways certain to be adopted as other parts of the country. An assembly of owners are planning wide, protected concrete roadways connecting the great centers and free of highway and railroad grade crossings.

Recognizing that the cost of construction and maintenance would soon bankrupt the state, it is suggested that the super-highways be built by private enterprise such as were the railroads, and that they all be operated under a single system.

The idea is not altogether new, but has not been much discussed in recent years, owing to the prevalent hope that federal state and local government would be able to improve existing roads and build additional mileage to meet the nation's needs.

As time from the constant increase in private automobiles and motor trucks, the business promises to grow so fast as to add to the congestion and to increase the wear and tear on the roads.

The country is being treated to a demonstration of extreme leniency and favoritism in the treatment of certain persons charged with offenses against the public weal. We have in mind that delightful character, Robert W. Stewart, listed as a default oil applicant, who is seeking to evade appearance before the United States senate to answer questions in regard to the Teapot Dome Inquiry.
