ROCKEFELLER, JR., SUBPOENAED TO TESTIFY AT SENATE PROBE OF TEAPOT DOME OIL SCANDAL

Senator Walsh Changes Mind After First Deciding Not to Summon Rockefeller; Committee Members Suggest Rockefeller's Appearance.

WASHINGTON, Feb. 9.—The teapot-dome committee issued a subpoena today for John D. Rockefeller, Jr., to testify at its hearing Saturday. The subpoena, which is the first of its kind, would call Rockefeller to testify in view of the fact that his testimony had been received by correspondence, Rockefeller had written Walsh that he had never seen or heard of Robert W. Stewart, chairman of the Stimulated Oil of Indiana, before the committee, and that Stewart had told him several years ago the standard had no part in the mysterious 1921 death of oilmen.

Rockefeller would have been subpoenaed to testify at the hearing of the teapot-dome committee, which is now being held in the Senate chamber, after the committee had received a letter from Rockefeller's attorney, which stated that Rockefeller would not appear at the hearing unless the committee agreed to subpoena him.

Stewart was arrested under a writ of habeas corpus which he declined to answer. All questions of the teapot-dome committee, including the one which led to the subpoena, were answered by Stewart in his own handwriting.

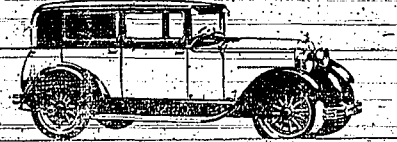

Prisoners During January Averaged 26 Years of Age

The oldest was 48 and the youngest 19, while the average age is 24. Nine were married and 13 single. All the prisoners were men. 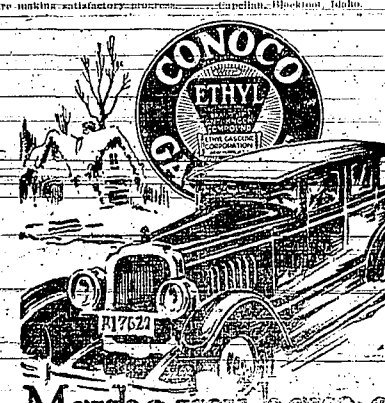

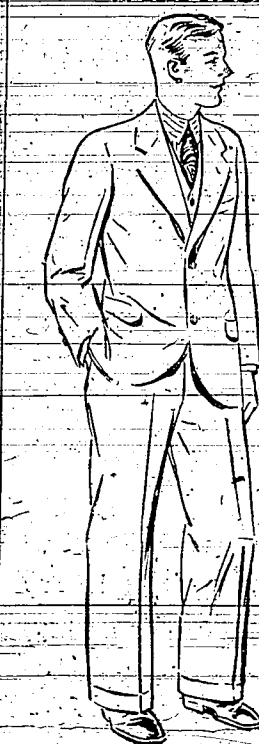

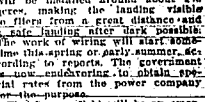
