YOUNG MAN IS KILLED WHEN HIT BY AUTO

Orville Sliger Instantly Killed by Car on North Side Highway Yesterday. Mother Severely Injured. Inquest is Postponed.

JEROME, March 8.—Orville Sliger, 19, was instantly killed and his mother, Mrs. Elizabeth Sliger, severely injured when the two were struck down by the car driven by Robert Wright and one-half mile north of Jerome on the North Side highway yesterday.

Both were struck immediately to Jerome and Mrs. Sliger taken to the city of St. Paul, Minn., for treatment. Her injuries, said from broken and contusion, appear to be internal. The car, a 1924 Buick, was driven by Sliger, who was killed at the scene of the accident.

According to reports of the accident given by Mrs. Sliger, who appeared at the inquest, she and her 19-year-old son were driving in a Ford truck loaded with household goods, when a tractor, on a route from Jerome to the city, struck them about half mile east of Jerome to their day home.

Stopping the car as soon as possible he hurried back, finding the boy dead and Mrs. Sliger screaming with pain. He drove back to the scene of the accident to the home of Julian Galentine, where he brought back with him—both Mrs. Sliger and her son.

Coroner Scherhorn called a jury on Monday and postponed the hearing for ten days or until Mrs. Sliger has recovered from her injuries. It was said that she would have had room to pass between the truck and the right hand side of the highway.
