RESIGNATION OF MELLON IS DEMANDED

TEAPOT DOME AFFAIR TAKES STRANGE TURN

Senator Norris of Nebraska Takes President Coolidge to Task for Failure to Ask for Mellon's Resignation Some Time Ago.

WASHINGTON, March 12.—A demand for the resignation of Secretary of Treasury Mellon and a Democratic denunciation of the Sinclair contribution to the nation, came in the Senate today in a result of Teapot Dome disclosures.

The developments included a statement by Senator Norris, Republican, Nebraska, that President Coolidge should have asked for Mellon's resignation the day after Mellon's Saturday night admission of knowledge of the Harry Sinclair contribution to the Teapot Dome.

A speech to the Senate by Senator Robinson, Democratic floor leader, in which he said that the Sinclair case was a disgrace to the nation and that he intended to bring the matter to the attention of the public.

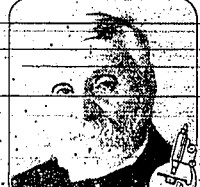

Time was when the newspapers of this country indulged with glee in the then popular sport of scoring the so-called trusts as the greatest of all threats against the public welfare. From time to time lists were published indicating the extent of the worldly possessions of the Morgans, the Rockefellers, the Morgans, the Mellons, the Vanderbilts and the scores of other millionaires whose personalities and names are linked with the history of events during the last quarter of a century.

We have in mind a recent editorial appearing in the Oregon Grange Bulletin, as follows: "The estate of Mrs. Anna Harkness, widow of Stephen Harkness, one of John D. Rockefeller's partners in the oil business, has just been appraised at \$107,000,000, or more than double what it was when she inherited it from her late husband a few years ago."

This is perhaps typical of the old-time and antiquated propaganda that used to find evidence with the general public. The inference thrown out is that the Harkness estate, appraised at \$107,000,000, consists of actual cash, bonds and twaddle. In all probability, if the real truth were known, practically every dollar of those millions is tied up in industries that are today in active operation providing payrolls far more substantial than the dole that charity misgud folk would have passed around as a sort of alms. And in answer to the question as to why the government should not be paid for services rendered in the protection of property, the query might properly be propounded as to the nature of that protection. As a matter of fact these vested interests are already paying and paying handsomely for the support of government both local, county, state and national.

And to show how this inheritance works a hardship on many an unhappy and sorrowing widow and her brood, there are innumerable cases of levies by the federal government against estates that consist solely of lands and real estate of no liquid value, levies that had to be met by taking the last cent of life insurance and therefore the bread and butter to keep life in the bodies of the fatherless.

All fair enough to get after the idle rich, the miser, but in this day and age there are very few in this class. The wealth of America is being used for the development of our vast natural resources, for the promotion of industry and for the general welfare. The man with his millions gets nothing more out of his plate of ham and eggs than the farm hand or the store clerk; his stewardship is enlarged, it is true, but that enlargement imposes its obligations and responsibilities that possibly offset the possession of wealth.

The proper use of wealth brings its own reward in affording occupation for millions of people whose occupation for enjoyment is just as keen as that of those who direct and control that wealth. To be busy is to be happy under normal conditions. The loss of selfishness, the more certain those opportunities for a fair deal for all who are willing to take their place in the world as burden-bearers.
