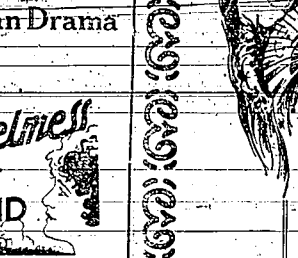

COMMISSIONERS NEAR TO FINAL BUDGET FIGURES

Hospital Estimates Reduced, Also Tax Collection to Bring Total Within Levy.

In the effort to solve the increasingly perplexing problem of balancing the hospital budget, the county commissioners, in accordance with the recommendation of the auditing committee, last evening passed a resolution to allow the voters to decide at the next general election whether the institution should be leased or sold to satisfy the needs of the community.

While no formal order has been submitted it is unofficially stated that the board has been made known toward its sale.

Since the maintenance cost at present is over \$100,000 per day, the commissioners have announced a new schedule of rates, which will reduce the charge for private room \$7 per day and for ward half that amount. Following the first of the month the hospital supplies are on the increase in price and that the Twin Falls county hospital is a costly one to maintain and as such cannot be standardized and therefore only high priced grade nurses can be employed and further that present cost of operating is far in excess of prices charged by the hospital and is not covered that on and after April 1, 1928, prices be changed to \$7 per day for private rooms and \$3.50 per day for ward patients.

The resolution submitted by the committee and worked on by the auditor, said:

"We find that the loss of maintaining the hospital is increasing from year to year, largely caused by the care of indigent poor and by others who refuse to pay their hospital bills. We think it would be good business, and also economy, to purchase a small tract of land for a poor farm, which would not only care for those located at the hospital, but also care for our very poor in the county, which amounts to about \$10,000 annually in county charges and the number's positions."

"We would also recommend to the county commissioners the advisability of selling or leasing the hospital, keeping in mind hospital care for the indigent, in this transaction."

"We further recommend that the question of disposing of the hospital, either by sale or lease, be left to a vote of the taxpayers at the next general election."

Figures obtained from the office of the county clerk show that the county commissioners estimate lower the hospital budget slightly over \$200,000 for the year 1928.

This brings the institution within the operating cost shown for the past year, and would necessitate the same levy of six cents.

Consideration of the budget of the office of the county treasurer yesterday afternoon by the county commissioners resulted in a budgeted saving of \$50,000 of which \$20,000 was from the estimate for extra help and \$30,000 from the proposed salary advance for two deputies.

Total budget figures for the current year, according to the treasurer, now stand at \$1,000,000, but this may be altered by the county commissioners before the final closing are reached. The estimated tax levies are as follows:

The budget is now on file in the office of the clerk, where the public may make such examination as they desire. The board will meet at a public hearing before the board makes final certification of the proposed expenditures.



CLASSY WORK OF NORTH IDAHO TEAM FEATURES HOOP TOURNEY

Coeur d'Alene Scores One Sided Victories Against Twin Falls and Boise; Bruns Beats Salmon; Grace and Salmon Eliminated.

POCAHELLO, March 16.—(Special to The Times)—Coeur d'Alene high school's basketball team proved the sensation of the first day's play in the state tournament which began here Thursday afternoon. The fast North Idaho outfit stomped Twin Falls, 38 to 19, in the opening game, and in the evening routed Coeur d'Alene by practically doubling the score on Boeie, a team that was fresh, while their opponents had already played one game.

Morrow has shown an excellent game from Coeur d'Alene, 21 to 25, that required three extra periods and left fans in a frustrated mood. In the evening today's action consisted from Pocahello, 17 to 11.

Twin Falls comes back after being badly beaten by Coeur d'Alene in the afternoon. Twin Falls came back and routed the weak Salmon team, 36 to 20 last night. This defeat put Salmon out of the tournament, for they had already lost to Ashton in an afternoon contest.

Extra periods were needed in the Pocahello game, 25 to 22, although only after an extra period. Throughout this contest the crowd of 2000 was kept in an uproar of excitement as half and half matches between Pocahello and Thurman from Huntington later put up a splendid exhibition against Grace, eliminating this team from the tournament, 23 to 21.

Coeur d'Alene looks to be the class of the tournament, with morning flight at their heels. Both teams play whirlwind basketball, featured by fast passing and brilliant shooting.
