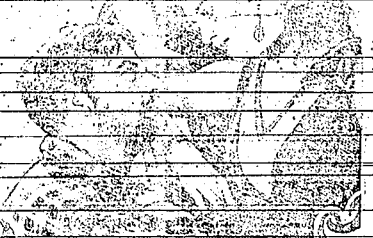

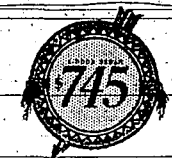
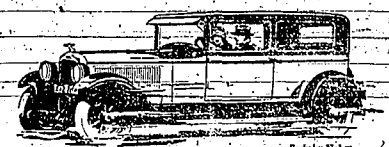

Prices of Grain Continue Climb

RAISE LATE CROP—The upward trend during the week ending March 27 and yesterday's advance in prices for this season's crop to date, according to the latest estimates of the United States agricultural committee, may reach at Chicago an amount higher than that for the corresponding period for the first time this season. That prospect, that the world's requirements for bread grains will nearly equal the surplus in the principal exporting countries that estimate production continues to be a strengthening factor in the wheat market—Further export advances of 1/2¢ and barley are holding the market firm for these grains. A good demand from domestic consumers, together with some further export activity, advanced corn, oats and rye prices to the highest prices for the season to date. This movement nearly 1¢ per bushel as a result of a good crusher demand. Farmers have expressed an intention of planting nearly 2 per cent more corn this season, nearly 2 1/2 per cent more barley and about 14 per cent more oats, but less spring wheat and oats. While the Liverpool market weakened slightly during the week, prices advanced at several continental European markets, including Berlin and Paris. Southern hemisphere shipments were smaller and stocks on ocean passage were reduced. The northern hemisphere wheat harvest has begun with the harvesting of the Indian crop now in process. The average this season is reported slightly larger than last season, with conditions apparently slightly improved over their average. While the official forecast of production will be available late another month, projections during recent years has supplied only small quantities for export and inland fields, consistently above the average are secured during the current season, the Indian harvest will not be an important factor in export market situation during the current year.

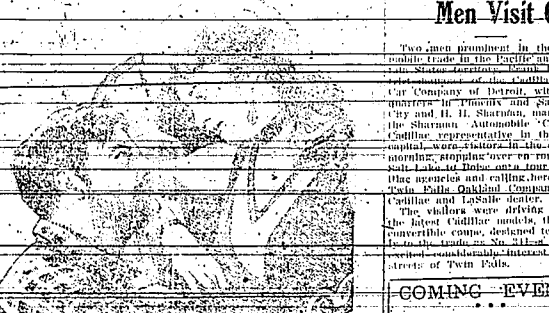

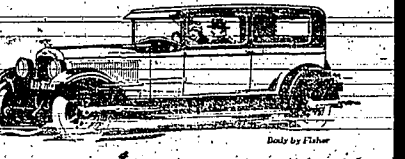

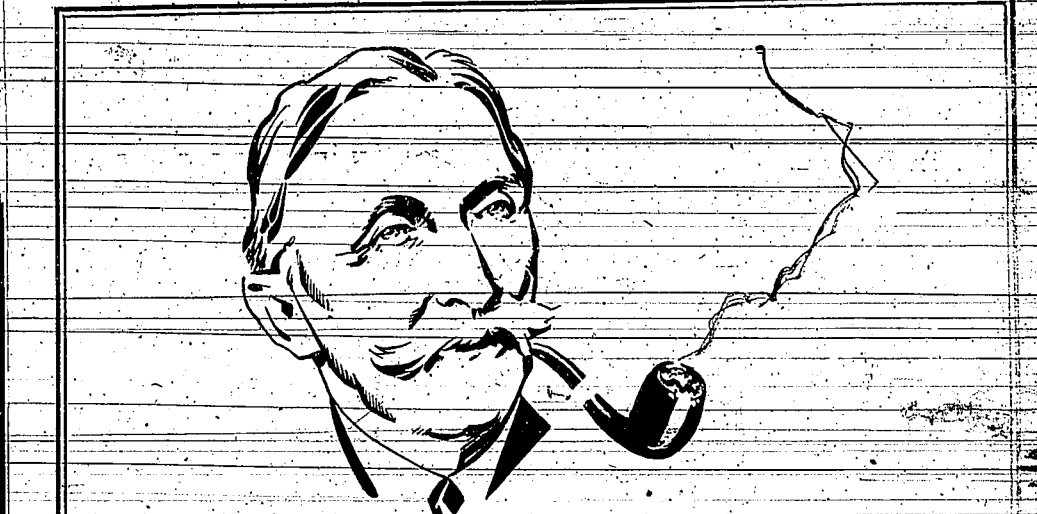
