Obviously it is impossible for the lay mind to understand the workings of the school of diplomacy in the realm of world politics and statesmanship.

The Soviet government of Russia, some time ago, through its representatives, presented to the League of Nations a program the goal of which is the actual and absolute disarmament of every nation throughout the world.

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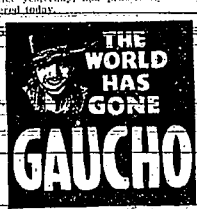

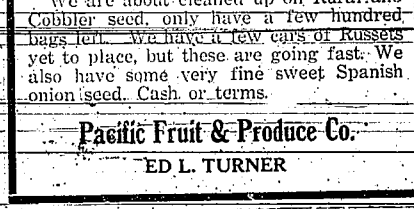

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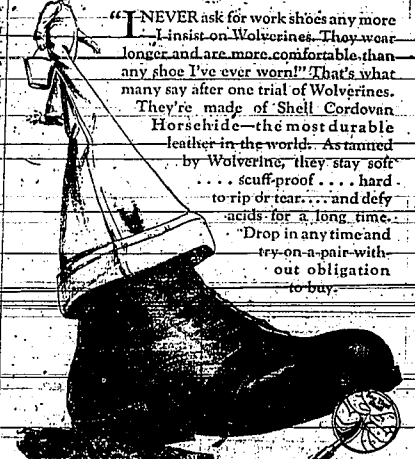
