**Chandler Proves Power in Relief Work**  
**Toronto Man Opened Snowdrifts With Chandler**  
 So Other Cars Could Pass  
 A KING, 92 Blackthorn Avenue, Toronto, Ontario, was instrumental in relieving the plight of over fifty stranded cars, carrying over one hundred and twenty-five passengers, during a terrific blizzard which swept the road between Toronto and Buffalo, N. Y., recently. The Chandler driven by William King, with Dr. L. H. Johnson, Dr. English, T. Norris, and S. Hinton, en route from Cleveland to Toronto as passengers, struck into the heart of the blizzard near Buffalo.  
 "We must have passed at least 100 cars stuck in the snow all along the road," Mr. King said. "One car was 400 yards out in an open field, the owner having obviously lost his sense of direction and found his way out there under the impression his car still on the road. On the way the drifts were so bad that we passed a snowdrift stuck solidly and unable to move."

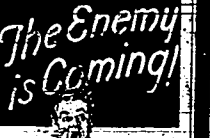

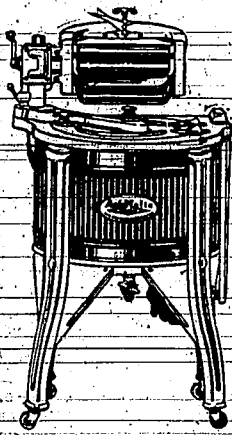

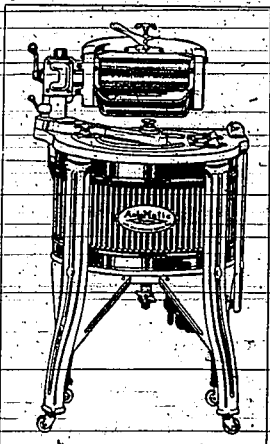

**NEW YORK**—With the melting season at hand the Garden Clubs of America and the American Nature Association have issued a "code of conduct" for "outdoor good manners" and for "billboard restriction."

"Billboards—those tall, slender structures to clean up picnic spots," Arthur Newton Fack, president of the American Nature Association, issued the following statement in January: "America is known for its advertising, but are we proud of so many of our roadside landscapes with ugly, signboards? Indeed, when we face the question most of us will agree that the roadside landscape is not the place for advertising except perhaps very limited commercial districts."

"Signboards and billboards have shown us one way of going about it. This way has its roadside sign plants. A highway sign, planted and protected by the State Highway Commission or Forestry Department, or under the National State Park Commission, such as in New Jersey, is poor meat for the outdoor advertiser. There obscure no law here to keep them. They rather frame it. But rows of trees do make it hard to read billboards, as advertisers will know if it is illegal in both New York and New Jersey, as well as in most other states. It is better to place many signs already have passed laws forbidding advertising signs on right-of-way."

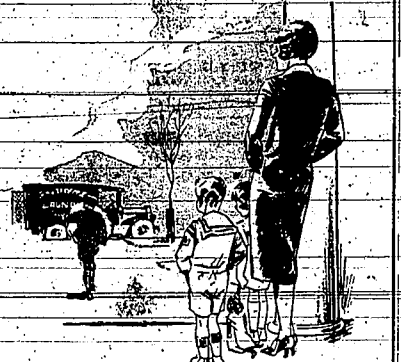

Many are mothers, but the group includes teachers, social workers, nurses, nurses, and professional women who are actively engaged in volunteer work. For such women it is invaluable by the publication of several books, which aim at bringing technical information to the lay reader, as well as to the student.

The American Association of University Women emphasizes the period of childhood during the first twelve years of school in the United States. Two by four millions children out of a total of twenty million between the ages of five and 12 years are in the public elementary schools. These schools are entirely supported by public funds and are controlled by boards of education. There are 14,000,000 public elementary schools in the United States, which are just as good or better than any other type of school system. In fact, it is estimated that the enlightenment of a community and the betterment of its schools. Unlucky women realize that they must first understand what the elementary school children are doing, and, second, bring pressure to bear to improve local schools. This implies knowledge and active cooperation with school officials.

During the last 25 years, there has been a phenomenal growth in technical education for the home and in the curriculum of the elementary school. The curriculum of the elementary school has undergone radical changes brought about by the realization that the child must be taught not only to read but also to think. There are certain subjects which should be given preference because they are socially more valuable. The last 25 years have witnessed great progress in both subject and method. The curriculum of the elementary school must change—they must know about social changes. They must understand what they are doing and why they are doing it. They must appreciate the psychological principles behind modern school methods. This means study—intensive study for women whose major field is in education. But the college woman in the home can do this by reading and by undertaking this task of studying, analyzing and evaluating elementary school methods.

The final stage of child life is adolescence. To complete the study of the education of children, the association has included in its program a study of this age. The work is just beginning and will be steadily developed.

The Educational program of the American Association of University Women is a program in adult education which says that no woman's education can be complete unless she is a homemaker, an active citizen, or a professional woman who must go on studying. 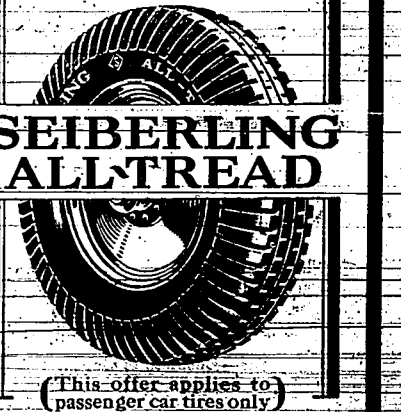

QUICK ACTION FOR MURDERERS IN HIGH COURT

Reversals of Lower Courts Rare; Little Leniency; Cases Advanced.

By HERBERT LITTLE. (Fallon Press Staff Correspondent) WASHINGTON, March 30—Condemned criminals get short shrift from the United States Supreme Court these days.

The court has adopted a policy of advancing all criminal cases, particularly capital cases, for early attention, entirely eliminating the two to three years of delay in execution that murderers many years ago obtained by the mere process of appealing to the court.

Great reluctance always has been manifested by the court, however, in overturning the death decrees of the state courts appealed from. The late Justice Brandeis, in a dissenting opinion, is told of a veteran judge advising a junior member of a state bench, in a recent case, to "give the public the benefit of the doubt, and keep the men in jail." That is, in a sense, how the attitude of the nine Supreme Court justices often results. Their reluctance to interfere with the justice of the states is marked.

Most of the great murder cases of the nation have been brought before the court in the final phase. When a final judgment of death has been rendered, the court almost invariably has refused to interfere. Notable among these in recent years were the appeals of Gerald Chapman, the famous mail robber executed by the state of Connecticut and the Sacco-Vanzetti case from Massachusetts.

One exception may prove the rule. This was the famous case from the District of Columbia, in which the court reversed a guilty sentence for a young Chinese convict of the murder of one of three members of Chinese mission, who were found guilty in the mission's building here.

Justice Brandeis in this case wrote a historic opinion. "The three members of the mission were innocent of the crime to which the law had subjected the young defendant. The three were innocent. The law had tried again, but the jury disagreed and he was released after seven years in prison."

Chapman unsuccessfully contended that the state could not punish a man in a holdup until he finished a 20-year sentence in Atlanta, which he had serving in the state prison.

In the Sacco-Vanzetti case, three members of the highest court during the court's summer recess, held that this body had no jurisdiction to interfere. 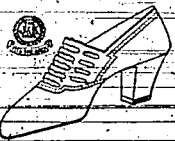

LONDON, March 30.—The Indian people, looking at the commission of inquiry, known as the Simon Commission, see in it a great struggle in the capitalist empire of the world. India readily sees in the Simon Commission all of the elements of danger attendant upon reforming the "mandates" which in effect would strengthen imperialist power in India and tighten the bonds of the British Empire.

The Indian leaders must make up their minds on their future course in the opinion there is an middle course. They must imperialize themselves and share with their erstwhile opponents who are secured from exploiting and governing the masses, or they must believe themselves and trust the masses in a program of common ownership, control and administration of all land, industry and their enterprises. It is my belief that these are the two courses open to India in view of its many problems of religion, language and race.

If the first choice is made, the leaders of India must settle down to an unrelenting and unrelaxing regime and after a lot of noisy, impractical, arguments and dogmatic flourishes, must devote themselves to the routine of exploiting, draining, impoverishing and robbing their own people till their workers and peasants make a clean sweep of them; for the time must come when the vast masses of India awaken and demand their freedom by force. I am not writing "revolutionary" propaganda.

My statement has historical backing. The Indian Mutiny is not to be forgotten. The British Empire is not to be taken for granted. If the leaders of India have courage and far-sightedness which are signs of cultured nations, must be able to see the danger of the British Empire to their own people. Let all Indian imperialists, socialists and labor leaders, workers and industrial workers in every country and peasants in every district, know that the British Empire is not to be taken for granted. 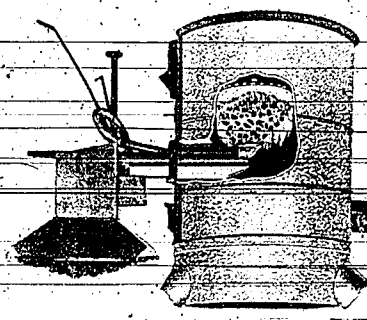
