Fourth Year Men Run Up Big Total of Points in Interclass Event.

The senior class staged an overwhelming victory in the class meet held at Lincoln field yesterday afternoon. While a cold wind made the athletes and spectators shiver, the winners were most uncomplaining and smiling faces, usually shy before, being shown for so early in the season.

The junior class trilled the seniors to 12 1/2 points, second, with the sophomore camp in third, their 10.5 points, and the freshmen in fourth, with 4.5 points.

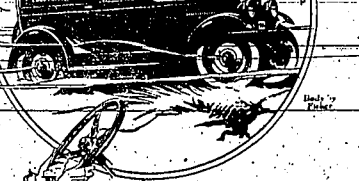

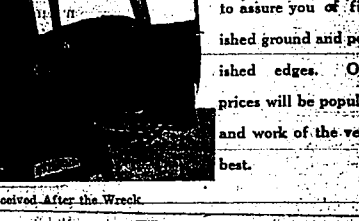

AIRPORT PLANS GIVEN PUBLIC CONSIDERATION

Chamber of Commerce Director Put Matter Up For Public Discussion; Tract Located.

Plans for an airport for Twin Falls, Idaho, are being given public consideration for the first time by the Chamber of Commerce, which will hold a public hearing on the subject Friday evening. When an announcement was made that the right site can be secured for approximately \$7000.

The tract, which will be the approval of W. E. Kilian, engineer for the federal department of commerce, is about 25 acres lying in the northeast corner of the E. J. Breckenridge ranch on the highway boulevard, next to the canyon. The land can be bought for \$180 an acre, which is considered an advantageous price. While several locations have been considered, choice fell upon this one largely because of the character of the soil which would make it practicable for all kinds of aircraft without artificial surfacing and because of the natural drainage which it has.

The present plans provide for a main east and west runway 500 feet long and 300 feet wide at the narrowest point and an emergency runway 400 feet long and 300 feet wide. Space for hangars will be afforded at the sides of the field. Proximity to the paved road and the Twin Falls-Jerome bridge afford the added advantage of easy access to the north side town if desired. The plans as now submitted will make the field not only available for commercial planes, but small and private planes as well.

Immediate extension of airplane service in this many quarters and necessity for a landing field in level-impervious-places are being pointed out by the Henry Ford company in seeking airport space in the Twin Falls-Jerome field.

An airport location which will be indicated by the speed with which air travel is being popularized. Air lines for passenger service are being projected to cover the Pacific coast with headquarters on the "Government" route. Plans have been notified their intention of buying private as soon as hangars and landing privileges are available.

The chamber of commerce offers no suggestion for financing the project other than the possible marketing of a stock company and invite suggestions from the public. Implicitly, which will be the plan.

The location and the fact that private accommodations are not feasible for Twin Falls airport is a profitable field for public service in a well equipped airport.

Advantage that Twin Falls offers as a distributing center for mail has been in the six states lines operating from here daily and the Wells-Vulcan green rail line to the north. Value of the location of the proposed airport is the location of the Green Short Line and from this source alone there would be substantial revenue.

While the city officials have been tentatively approached in the matter of submitting a bond issue, nothing will be done along that line. This is in excess of a public demand—immediate action however necessary if the tract under consideration is to be taken, as it will otherwise be cropped, and this additional cost be assessed against it.

additional ten mile stretch of the main line across southern Idaho from King Hill to Tropic is being considered at a cost of \$47,000. This will extend the entire double track on that busy part of the Green Short Line, one of the system to 34 miles from Reviville through Tropic to the 700 foot grade to Tropic.

"This new second track," President Gray says, "is being built to provide against any possibility of congestion and is in accord with the company's policy of keeping fully abreast of transportation requirements in the hearing Grand Canyon."

It includes the handsome public building which will have other buildings on Bright Angel street and the water tower which will bring water to the lines and cabins from a spring nearly 1000 feet below in the canyon. Further up the mountain the lake and the fact that the new station will be built on a high plateau will provide for the year's program.

Yellowstone Park.

At the same time, in anticipation of increased travel to Yellowstone Park, substantial sums are set aside this year for further improvement of the line from Pocatello to West Yellowstone.

Extensive improvements are also being undertaken on the Los Angeles and Salt Lake and Green-Vulcan lines of the system, including the repair of several new bridges and the replacement of the old bridges and the fitting of two more tunnels, and on the latter the widening of cuts and embankments. On all units, passenger tracks are to be lengthened this year to provide for the more expeditious handling of freight through longer or trains made possible by heavier motive power.

Highway and railway grades are to be repaired at a number of additional points as a further step in the promotion of safety.

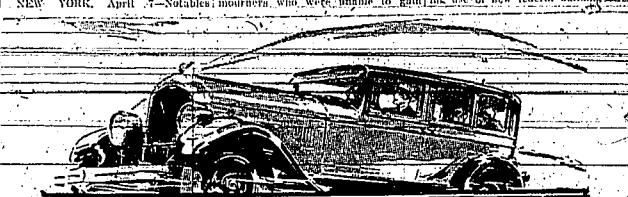

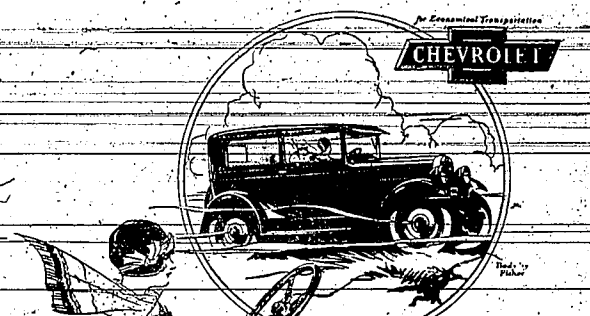

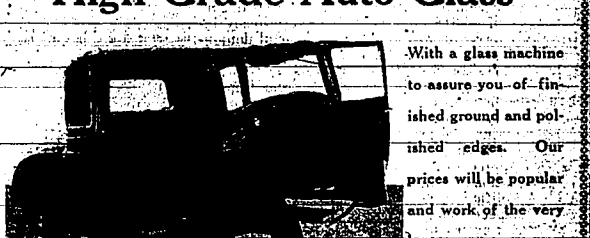

AIRPORT PLANS GIVEN PUBLIC CONSIDERATION

Chamber of Commerce Directors Put Matter Up for Public Discussion; Tract Located.

Plans for an airport for Twin Falls under consideration for the past several weeks by the Twin Falls Chamber of Commerce were given public consideration at the directors' Friday evening, which announcement was made that the plan site can be located on the south side of the city. The tract, which has met the approval of W. E. Kling, engineer for the proposed airport, is situated on the northeast corner of the 12th and Broadway streets, on the latter boulevard, next to the canyon. The land can be bought for \$150 an acre, which is considered an inexpensive price. While several locations have been considered, choice fell upon this one largely because of the character of the soil which would make it profitable for all kinds of endeavor without artificial irrigation and because of the natural drainage which it has.

The present plan provides for a main east and west runway, 2000 feet long and 300 feet wide in the narrowest point and 1000 feet wide at the north and south ends, 1600 feet long and 300 feet wide. Space for hangars will be afforded on the east side of the field. Proximity to the paved road and the Twin Falls-Jerome highway will afford the most convenient access to the north side town. It is also noted that the plans of now 12.5 acres will be sufficient to accommodate open to commercial planes, but all mail and private planes as well. Hangar service is seen in many districts and necessity for a landing field is felt here. Several local people have notified their intention of buying planes as soon as hangars and landing place, hangars are available.
