## TWIN FALLS TO OPEN U-I SEASON WITH IDAHO FALLS HERE MAY 15; PLAYING SCHEDULE IS APPROVED

### Much Important Business Done at League Meeting Sunday; Prospects for Successful Year Are Bright.

Idaho Falls will open the Utah-Idaho league season at Twin Falls this year with Poncelet playing at Boise and Ogden at Salt Lake. This is provided for in the schedule adopted by representatives of the league, who met at the Chamber of Commerce rooms in Twin Falls Sunday afternoon following a luncheon at the Rogerson hotel.

A number of interested fans were present in addition to the following club representatives: Tom Leslie, Ogden; J. C. Dirks, Salt Lake; Dr. E. L. Alexander, Twin Falls; Ray McKeig, Boise; and Mr. Armistead, Pocatello. Jess Bishard, secretary to President Fred M. Nye, who was present acted as representative of Idaho Falls by request of that club.

Considerable business of an important nature was transacted, chief of which was the adoption of the playing schedule proposed by C. Dickson, sports editor of the Salt Lake Tribune, who acted as official time-keeper on May 15. It is composed of 364 games, 181 between clubs in the league and 183 between clubs in the league and outside clubs.

The schedule, which is being played on Sunday, includes Salt Lake, Ogden, Boise, and Pocatello. The league will begin its season at Ogden, but upon the request of Salt Lake the order was reversed, Salt Lake playing at home in the first game.

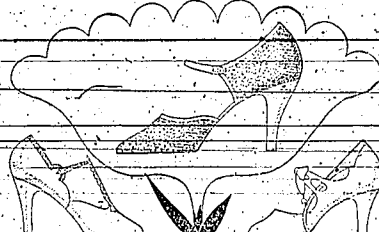

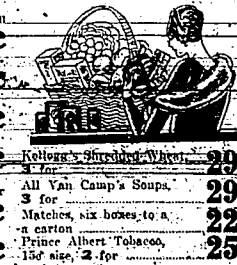

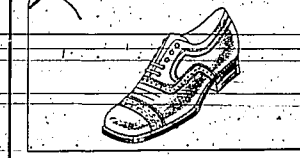
