# SEEK TO MAKE WATER SYSTEM PAY ITS WAY

## New Ordinance Placed on First Reading Shows What Can Be Accomplished.

First reading was held tonight of a new ordinance which has for its purpose the raising of water rates to a point that will make the department self-sustaining.

Commissioner Lem A. Chappin of the finance department has been giving the matter serious study over a period of several weeks, consulting with City Attorney E. M. Swezey in drafting a measure that the commission believes to be fair to all water users both inside and outside the limits of the municipality of Twin Falls.

Publicity in sought for the new schedules that everybody interested may have an opportunity to present their views and to that end the ordinance will be given three readings.

The new rates established are a charge of \$1.65 per month for a minimum of 6,000 gallons, which means \$1.50 net—the assessed rate is \$1 net for 4,000 gallons.

Excess gallons remain on the first 6,000 gallons, namely 8 cents additional up to 10,000 gallons, 7 cents additional up to 20,000 and 6 cents to 30,000 or more.

Rates for water customers outside the city limits will be \$2.25 net for 6,000 gallons, the higher rate being considered fair because out of town residents are not taxpayers, contributing nothing to the maintenance of the municipality through the city treasury either in maintenance or through the water service being furnished. Therefore a matter of accommodation and service which the city, however, is glad to render.

Estimated Water Budget According to the figures submitted last night by Commissioner Chappin the city's needs show a total of 2,500 customers, but figures on the basis of 2,000 will also show the city \$30,000 a year at the new rate of \$1.50 net. Estimating that there are 250 out of town customers, this adds \$37,500 to bring in \$115,000, sprinkling and flushing, \$2,684.22 and city parks \$1,103.80, no charge for fire hydrants is included in the estimated receipts and without this leaves the total \$111,212.80. The estimated cost of operation for the coming year is \$62,600, leaving a deficit of \$48,612.80.

Water Metering License Suggestion was made by Commissioner Chappin that with the return of building activity throughout the city it would be in the public interest to restore to the city's code a plumbing ordinance, parts of which were suspended some three or four years ago. This view met with the approval of the other commissioners with the result that city attorney Swezey was authorized to proceed to draft the "missing links" in the existing ordinance, particularly those providing for the appointment of a plumbing inspector and his removal from office and his return to be made by those engaged in building work.

As a result of the commission's deliberations in the committee on the bill introduced by Commissioner Chappin that no more competent man could be found to act as inspector than Mr. Murray, he having filed that position satisfactorily under the old ordinance. In co-operation with Mr. Murray the city attorney will have the amended ordinance ready for presentation to the commission next Monday evening.

Two building permits were presented last night, reaching favorable action. One was made by Ray McKay to construct a roof beer stand on the corner beyond the "Dixie" on the corner of Main avenue north, as in rooms of Main avenue north, and Hardy to construct an addition and make alterations to a residence at 163 Third avenue east at a cost of \$1,000.

# I. C. PENNEY SEES IN CO-OPERATION FLORIDA HOPE

State Chamber Asks Marketing of Citrus Products Through Big Organization.

Mr. Penney has been asked to assume the responsibility of marketing the citrus products of Florida.

Florida, according to recent disclosure by the Chicago packer, The Citrus Growers Association, is the chairman of the citrus committee of the state chamber of commerce, and has effected wide contact for and against the plan.

Mr. Penney, after making ample consideration of the proposal, has agreed with the following stipulations: The Florida citrus growers are to organize a marketing organization to be set up under the Capper-Volstead act.

Mr. Penney and Vice President Herbert Lewis of the Penney company are to agree to purchase their citrus for the growers, and supply a credit corporation shall be formed to properly finance the growers.

Mr. Penney states further that he has found manufacturers are making it difficult to obtain the organization, such as the Penney store, being able to cover costs along many lines in that arrangement.

"Moreover, we have found it fundamental in our marketing operation to have our managers and our employees an opportunity to own a part of the business instead of paying large salaries. For this reason I should want to have this restricted organization and management incorporated in the proposed cooperative organization, the supply company and the credit corporation—in the way of a pension, stock, participation in what they helped to create, and the criticism of the large salaries paid would be eliminated, and the returns be in accordance to the contribution made by each element."

This is the first step taken in any state to turn the entire marketing of the perishable fruit and vegetable products grown in the state as a whole to any chain store interest.

Some such chain store interest would place the Penney stores in a strong strategic position should vegetables through their immense number of stores, as they would be in a position to handle the prices, themselves and their competitors as well, including other chain stores and independent dealers. Mr. Penney states that the plan outlined will put the industry on its feet, in his opinion.

The returns to the growers of the state are said by Floridians at this time to be at the lowest point consistent with decency, although the retail price of the citrus products is the highest in the world.

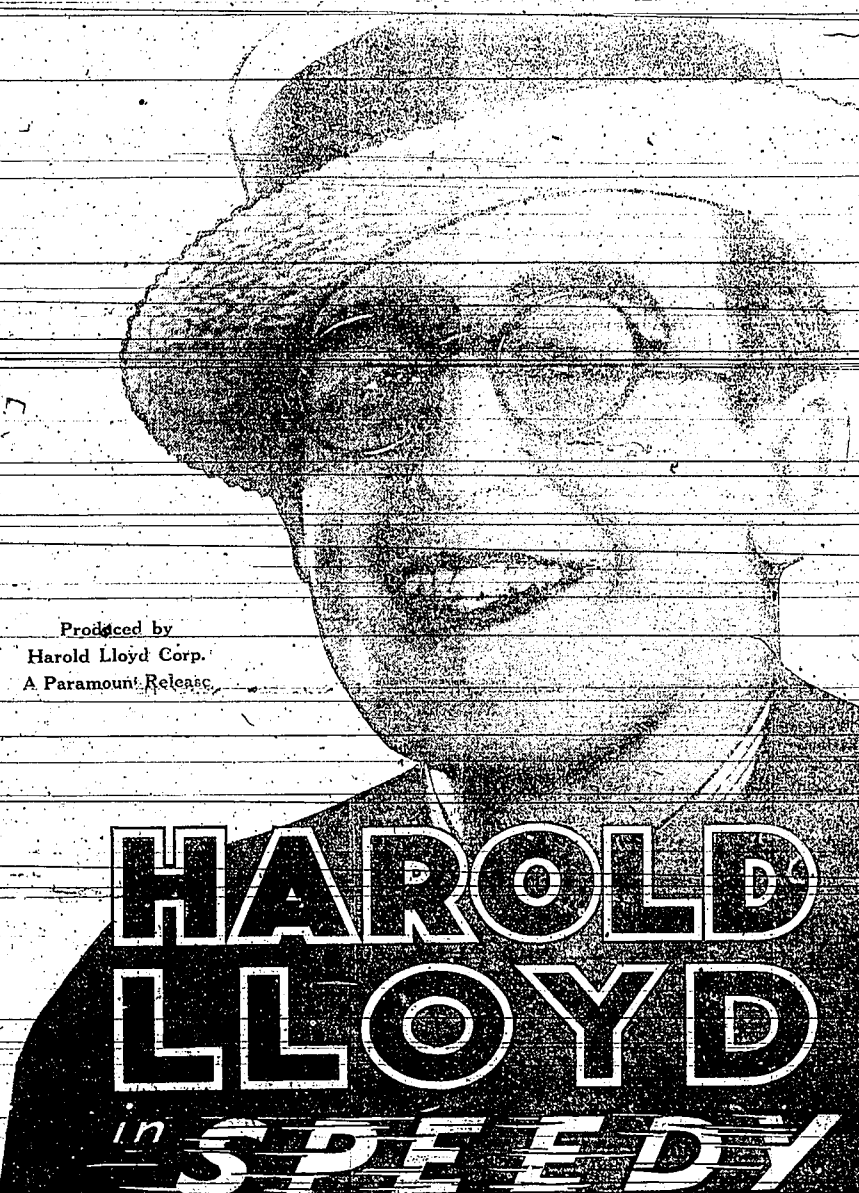

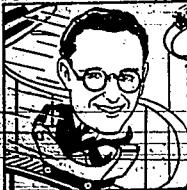

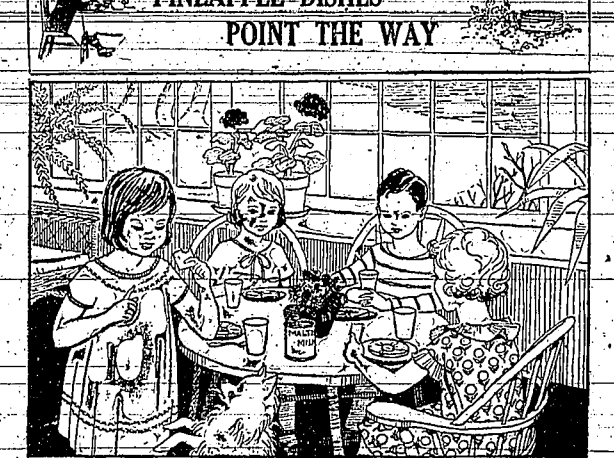
