### WESTERN PACIFIC OFFICIAL HOPES AUTHORITY WILL SOON BE ISSUED; NEVADA COMMISSION IS FAVORABLE

Vice President Eugene Fox Makes Statement on Plans for Building Connecting Link Between Western Pacific and Oregon Short Line

Following receipt by Twin Falls yesterday of authoritative information that the Commerce Commission of Nevada has granted the application of the Western Pacific and Oregon Short Line physical connection with the Oregon Short Line extension of the Union-Pacific at Wells, a telegram was dispatched by the Times to Eugene Fox, vice-president of the Western Pacific in charge of operations, San Francisco, asking if that official had any statement to make and extending congratulations over the prospect of the Western Pacific soon being able to assist in the further development of southern Idaho through the furnishing of direct transportation facilities between this state and the San Francisco territory.

### HUMBLEST AND HIGHEST HONOR THREE ARMEN

All Classes Rejoice Over Success of Men; President von Hindenburg and Chancellor Marx Each Send Telegrams

BERLIN, April 14.—Germany today acclaimed the three armen who made the first westward trans-Atlantic flight of the North Atlantic in the Junkers monoplane Bremen. From the aged president to the poorest peasant in the country there was rejoicing that Capt. Hermann Koehl, M. G. Jones and Capt. Harold Augustus Gatty had succeeded in doing what never had been done before. The Association of War Pilots arranged for all available airplanes to circle Berlin Sunday noon in honor of the fourth birthday of President Paul von Hindenburg, called Koehl.

Heartfelt congratulations to the brave aviator for their wonderful flight. Chancellor Wilhelm Marx: Heartfelt congratulations to the first European armen succeeding in crossing the Atlantic from west to east. We are especially grateful because the success was due to German success. Not since the first transatlantic flight, was an additional decisive step in trans-Atlantic aviation.

They all are particularly kind and traditional admirers of aviation who received new impulses through the participation of Colonel Fitzmaurice and the aviators shown by the United States and Canadian people. WASHINGTON, April 14.—Campaign tabulators for Secretary of Commerce Hoover claimed his nomination with 55 votes to be a sure thing. They claimed 874 delegates voted with 552 majority to nominate Hoover. Friends of Mr. Smith lay claim to 671 votes, just 63 votes short of the two thirds required for the Democratic nomination. ### IDAHO LOWEST CASUALTY LIST TUBERCULOSIS

Figures Show Only 13.9 Per Hundred Thousand With Utah Second

NEW YORK, April 14.—Three Western States, Idaho, Utah and Montana, had the lowest death rates from tuberculosis in the United States during 1924, with the fifteen States showing the highest mortality from this disease. Utah was second with a rate of 13.9 per 100,000, and the death rate being higher for these states than for any other in the United States.

Idaho had an exceptionally low rate of 12.9 per 100,000 for the year 1924 and 27. Other states, including Florida, Nebraska, Kansas, Iowa and Oregon, showed rates between 22.4 per 100,000 for Georgia and 75 per 100,000 for Tennessee.

### CANADIAN STEAMER MONTCALM IS DISPATCHED TO GREENLY ISLAND TO BRING BACK CREW OF BREMEN

Boat Will Transport Three Fliers to Civilization; Bremen Forced Down Because of Gasoline Shortage; Propeller and Tail Skid Broken; Details Still Meager

ST. JOHN'S, N. F., April 14.—In the black and ice-locked Strait of Belle Isle today three European aviators awaited the hour when they would be able to civilization to the world-wide acclaim as the first to fly an airplane westward across the north Atlantic ocean. The triumph of the Junkers monoplane Bremen and its German-Irish crew is one of the greatest in the history of aviation and explains in part why seven other aviators lost their lives in three previous attempts to make a similar flight.

A supply of gasoline which the best fliers of two continents had estimated would keep the plane aloft 15 hours lasted only 24 hours and the Bremen crew had set when they flew from Greenly Island between the mainland of Labrador and New Foundland.

Today the Bremen, its propeller and tail skid broken and its fuel tanks empty, is still far from the goal its crew had set when they flew from Dublin to land on this day morning.

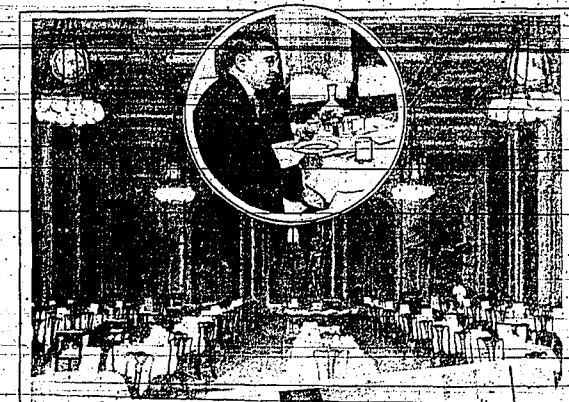
