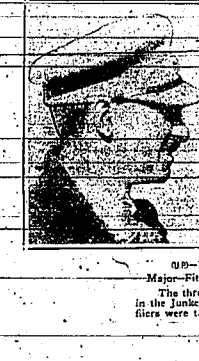
Train Schedule to Be Changed Sunday

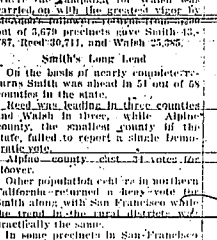

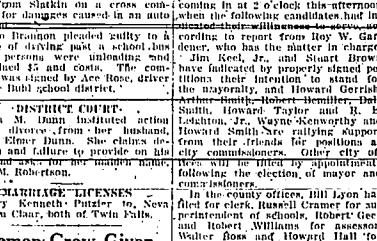

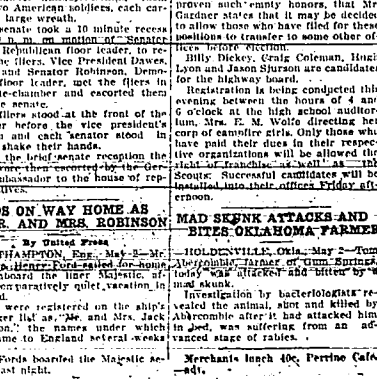
