

SHANGHAI BOMBER BOMBARDMENT BY SEAPLANE Tomado Sweeps Across Part Nebraska

ONLY SLIGHT DAMAGE DONE; TWO INJURED First Time in Present Civil War That Chinese Have Resorted to Use of One of Modern Methods of Fighting.

SHANGHAI, May 3.—A seaplane of the Anhwei province, China, at noon today, dropping four bombs on the Chinese section of the city.

Two Chinese were wounded by the explosives and one building was destroyed.

Three of the bombs were dropped near the Northern railway station in the Chinese section of the city.

This is believed to be the first occasion on which an airplane has been used in bombing a city during the five years of civil war.

Many of the Chinese soldiers carry umbrellas and declare their during this hurried attack.
