WASHINGTON, May 4.—Senator Thomas J. Walsh, Democrat of Montana, today made his statement in the logic of events to request that no further effort be made in Montana or elsewhere to promote his nomination.

IT'S NOT SO MUCH THE FLYING LANDING'S IMPORTANT.

Knowing that every three hundred miles or so in the Atlantic ocean there is a safe landing field with adequate hotel accommodations and every facility for the care of the air ship, much of the danger is taken from the adventure, and freight and passenger travel is due to be tremendously speeded up.

There is now in process of building the first of such floating squadrons, eight of which will make a bridge across the stormy Atlantic, according to published plans. Cost of the first one announced from Wilmington, Delaware as now being begun, is said to be estimated at \$1,500,000, and is to be located about 400 miles southeast of New York outside the fog line. It has been named the Langley. The cost of the eight has been estimated at \$25,000,000.

It sounds fantastic, but it is happening. Construction problems would perhaps differ but little from those of the huge floating drydocks. To the land dweller, it is adventures that give food for thought, but to marine engineers these are all in the day's work. The pilot's problem of picking out a small spot on the face of the ocean, so tremendously expansive and so very wet, presents factors of uncertainty. Yet pilots are doing that every day, for planes go land on the decks of ships prepared to receive them.

There can be no question but that the lack of parking spaces, tea rooms and road houses have been a great drawback to the attempts made to popularize trans-Atlantic flying. Equipped with radio, each station is a potent life-saving port, as well.

The more frequent the airdromes the more popular ocean flying is likely to become.

PROMINENT AMERICAN AS FUGITIVE AND STUDENT.

CO-OPERATION BASED ON PERSPIRATION.

Other conversations have sought and assurances held out. But cornstalks still are a waste and the crop just harvested and the waste committed have been sent to the land to be collected and burned. Now, however, it seems to have been conclusively demonstrated through experiments made in a chemical engineering plant under the direction of the Iowa State college, that wallboard can be made of the material at a good profit to the corn growers, the manufacturers and the dealers. The experiment has gone far enough to encourage plans for utilizing manufacturers of wallboard one of which may be located near Chicago. If the conditions are dependable, a new industry of much importance to agriculture and the crop just harvested and the waste committed will result. The cornstalk situation is an indication of the possibilities of the manufacturing development of the raw material furnished by the great farming country.

Indication Wide Response Demand Hatchery Growth

Marked activity in the sale of tickets for the annual dinner of the Fish and Game association continues with large sales to the members and friends in surrounding towns. Payment for the dinner tickets is often accompanied by an additional dollar for membership in the association. The hatchery plant in the canyon just at the city limits has become the objective for Sunday afternoon visitors from out of town becoming more numerous.

All the streams in the county will be open for fishing May 1 with the exception of the streams on the Minnahan forest reserve and the western end of Rock Creek above the forks and below the siphon, which leaves a stretch of open water of about 15 miles.

There have been about 20 complaints of violations of the fishing restrictions in the waters of Rock Creek near the city which will remain closed for the entire season. Fifteen of this class of offenses go to the game department of the state and the closing of fish hatcheries at all points are charged to the same department.

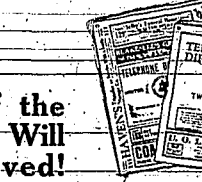

LONDON, May 4.—Statistics predicted the number of divorces in Great Britain this year will double that of 1927. They also predicted that 5,000 as against 2,500 in 1927.

Lord Justice's recent repudiation of Lord Holt's old conception of marriage is a complete vindication of the increase in divorce, not that

people know where they stand in the matter."

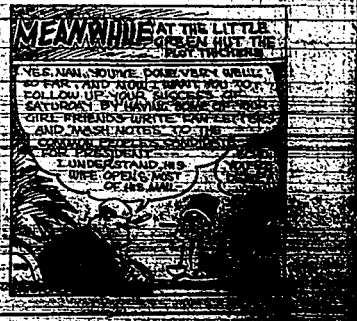
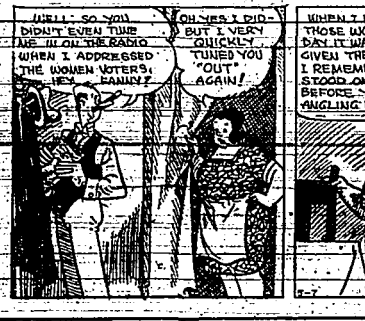
