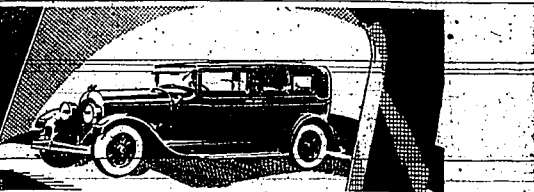

TRYING TO ANALYZE THE LIGHT HARVEST.
There never was a time in these newer days when more sentiment has developed in favor of church unity.

Recently there was presented in the Literary Digest a review of a census conducted by three of the most prominent denominations in the United States, a review that shows that 32 per cent of the three referred to, failed to obtain a single convert during the past year.

Armed with an abundance of figures, the Men's Church League of New York asked a simple question of the most prominent clergymen in the denominations, "What is the matter with the churches?" and received some particularly frank replies, some of which might merit sufficient interest in church life generally to cause some self-examination in all denominations.

A foreign missionary, Dr. C. H. Fein, of Princeton, New Jersey, home on furlough, writes "that the churches are suffering from fatty degeneration of the heart (wealth, luxury, and ease); pernicious anemia (lack of blood in theology and in the fight with sin); cerebro spinal meningitis (destruction of backbone and brain-center); cancer (inheritor in the supernatural); and neuritis (superstition, dogmatism to ridicule or criticism)."

Perhaps it is not safe to pay too much attention to the criticism of the foreign missionary who makes bold to flay the work of the Christian churches today. He may be thinking of those churches in the wealthy centers of the country who are accused of lack of spirituality, of extreme coldness, and of outspoken worldliness.

But here again comparisons are almost impossible because men and women to their own thinking have their own ideals and in their innermost souls are able to place a true valuation on the real meaning of what constitutes religious life and practice.

It is a question that presses for an answer, and many answers have been forthcoming ranging from that of the local merchant who looks upon the chain store as a practical institution that takes what it can and gives nothing, to that of the chain store which holds that it is a community solely for what business it can get out of it.

The merchandising group will also turn the cold eye of business scrutiny upon the customer with the idea of determining under what circumstances he is an asset or a liability. This is in conformity with the growing realization that the customer that costs more than the profit he yields is an economic milkstone.

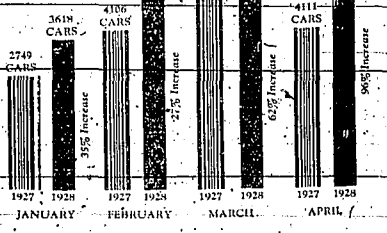
