AND ANOTHER DESERT MAY COME TO PRODUCTION.

A bond was posted this week with the State Commissioner of Reclamation for the reclamation of the Boise-Mountain Home irrigation project.
This does not mean that the construction work will be begun immediately. It does not even mean that to a certainty the beautiful rolling flats south and east of the city will ever be turned into the fat farm lands that follow the shining trail of the irrigation laterals. It is at least indicative that interest has not died in the project of making this district another and larger Twin Falls, for that will be the result if the proposed 25 mile tunnel is built through the Sawtooth mountains to connect Red Fish Lake with the south fork of the Boise river.

The east slopes of the Sawtooth mountains send down through innumerable tributaries a flood of sparkling spring water every spring. The problem of bringing this spring grace of water to the semi-arid lands south of the Boise river has intrigued the imagination of engineers for many years. James B. Hayes, son of Attorney S. H. Hayes of Boise has made the plans which have been checked by various authorities and each confirms the feasibility of the proposition.

It will cost \$40,000,000 and that is a sizable sum. Yet the promoter says that the money has been found. There will be a dam that will set new records for height and new water capacity records. The project will reduce Twin Falls to second place in size among irrigation enterprises of the world if carried through.

If the project is built, and the plans worked out for colonization are made effective, there will be need for mighty close harmony between the producers, the marketing agencies and the railroad carriers.

A few more duplications of Twin Falls production capacity, and Idaho will lead the world in agricultural per acre records.

GET UP EARLIER AND DO MORE WORK.

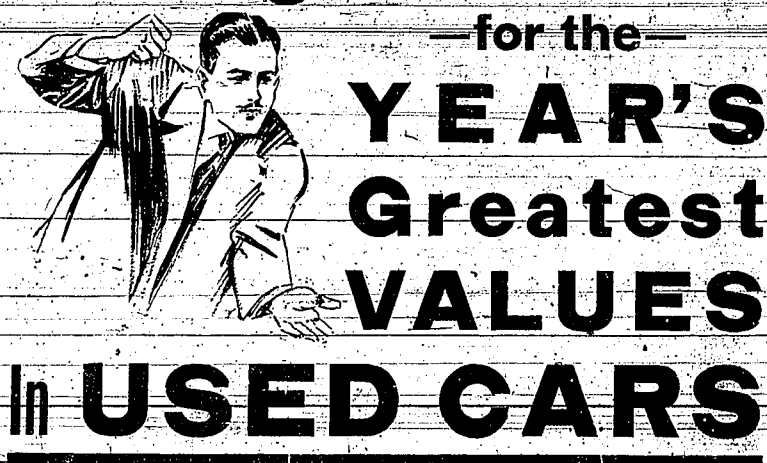
