IDAHOS GREATEST BIG FOR NATIONAL PUBLICITY.

The waters of the Snake River, dropping 212 feet down in the canyon of the Snake at a point about five miles from the city of Twin Falls and about two miles from the Twin Cataracts, form what is known as Shoshone Falls, one of the notable waterfalls of the world.

Shoshone is beautiful at all times and particularly so during the period of the full moon.

Presently this cataract is to be illuminated by a battery of powerful search lights so that the attraction will be permanent day and night, year in and year out.

Thanks to the initiative of the Idaho Power Company and with the co-operation of the Twin Falls Chamber of Commerce, this great natural attraction is to be made of tremendous value to the State of Idaho in interesting visitors from all sections of the country. Wide-spread publicity is to be given the fact that the cataract is to be illuminated so that people may flock here to enjoy what will be one of the greatest spectacles anywhere in the country.

Since the illumination of Niagara Falls was commenced some three or four years ago, hundreds of thousands of people have traveled to the United States and Canadian sides to behold something that has no equal anywhere in all the world. Those who have been privileged to see the mighty Niagara under the glare of the search lights from several batteries of powerful electric lamps will never forget the experience. In the east of Niagara the electricians had to overcome the problem of illumination of the falling water at long range, while at Shoshone Falls the lights are to be placed comparatively close so that less power will be required than at Niagara but with equally satisfactory results.

Announcement by the Idaho Power Company is to the effect that thirty flood lights are to be used, three to have a combined candle power of twenty-five million. Turning on of these lights in the not far distant future will be made a memorable occasion, the details of the program having been assigned the Twin Falls Chamber of Commerce.

The enterprise necessarily involves more or less extensive provision for the care and safety of the public. Parking places will have to be provided for thousands of automobiles and vantage points prepared and safeguarded where spectators may be enabled to enjoy the sight without any danger whatsoever.

It is impossible at this time to estimate the result of inauguration of an enterprise that will not only be a continual source of delight and pleasure to the residents of Idaho but to countless thousands of tourists who, learning of the scope of the spectacle, will be eager to see for themselves one of the greatest natural attractions west of the Mississippi river.

ROCKEFELLER'S ACTION INSPIRES CONFIDENCE.

WINEGAR BROTHERS OF WENDELL PLANT 335 ACRES OF POTATOES

Plan to Make Lincoln Farms of 1280 Acres into Stock Ranch; at Present Have Leased Many Acres Out As Small Farms to Other Men.

WENDELL, May 14.—One of the largest acreages of potatoes ever planted on one ranch in Idaho is being put into the old Lincoln farm, now owned by Clarence and William Winegar. A total of 335 acres of potatoes of this number 110 acres will be devoted to early planting. (L. H. Burns, and the balance to Nettle G. Burns.)

The Winegar brothers, who have had large experience in raising oats and potatoes in Utah, purchased the place last year. They have also added on the Newcomb tract, operating 240 acres devoted principally to hay and corn. Clarence Winegar now has 1280 sheep on the Newcomb tract and George Winegar has 1280 sheep on the Lincoln farm into a stock ranch. The Lincoln farm consists of 1280 acres of land.

This year they have leased 210 acres of the Lincoln farm to the Winegar family. This land will be devoted entirely to potatoes. Two partners have been leased since April 1, getting the seed into the ground.

They have also leased 150 acres of land in Greek Bogart, a well known farmer of the Wendell country. Of this 120 acres he is not over 20 acres will be devoted to Nettle G. Burns.

Two years after Alexander Graham Bell created the first telephone, a young man fresh from school entered the employ of a small concern that was then beginning the manufacture of these new talking instruments. The other day this man rounded out a half century of association with this concern, the Western Electric Company.

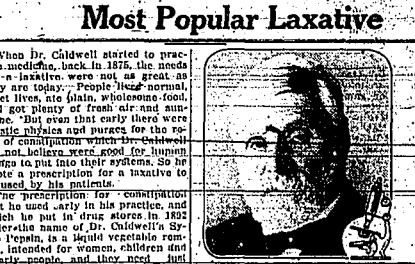

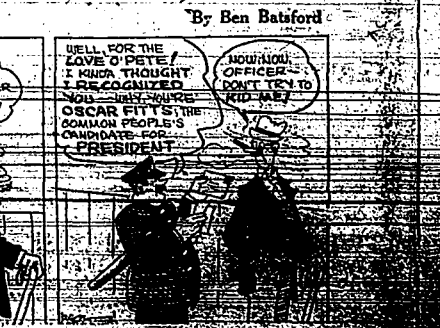

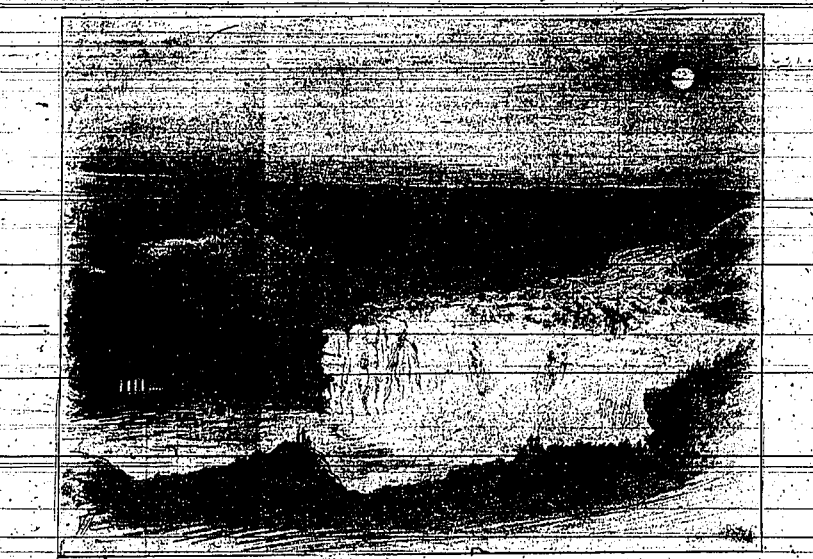
