Municipal Street Light Cost To Be Reduced June 1st

BUSINESS May 20.—On June 1, reductions from 50 to 20 percent depending upon the size of the lamp, and upon the number of lamps, will be made in the cost of street lighting in south Idaho cities, according to a schedule voluntarily filed by the Idaho Power Company with the Public Utilities Commission.

This reduction will affect 23 municipalities served by that organization and will save them an amount in electricity bills which will be used to improve service without additional cost above the price previously paid.

The action is in line with the company's promise to inaugurate a policy of making reductions from time to time. The rate schedule is the first of "so soon as rates which have heretofore not paid the cost of furnishing the service are made commensurate," to quote from the order of the commission approving the reduction in the cost of residence lighting put into effect last year. That was associated with a reduction in the light and cooling or water heating rates through operation known as the commutation rate.

The filing of the company with the commission, states that these reductions are made possible only by the elimination of rates under which service was furnished at less than cost but as well by operating economies and by the gradual increase in the rate of growth of the city.

The commission, in its order, says it serves, and confirm the understanding of your commission of the desirability of the company to reduce rates by its representatives, that reductions be made for those users paying the highest rates.

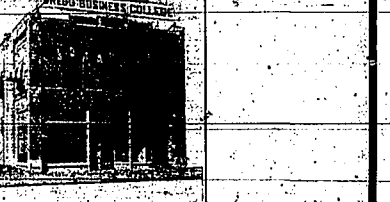
