Governor and Mayor Head Welcoming Committee as City Gives Greetings

SPECIAL TRAIN ARRIVES 11 A. M. Water Power Is Theme of Speech Tonight, Leaves Sunday for Home of Senator

The democratic candidate and Mrs. Smith entered the city today to the boom of a 15-gun salute for the New York governor residing in their cars. They passed through the city in a motorcade of 100 automobiles. The train arrived at 11 o'clock tonight.

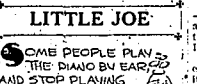

FROST DOES NO DAMAGE AS YET

Weather Report Says Grain Harvested and Threshing Completed With Prunes and Apple Picking Under Way.

No material damage was caused by the light frosts of the past week, according to the weekly survey of the weather bureau. The week opened with light to moderate heavy rains in the lower country and snow on the ridges throughout southwest Idaho. Following the rains, which interrupted prune picking and have harvesting the orchards and vineyards. Warm weather followed and by the close of the week the temperatures were considerably above normal. Gardens and truck crops continued to mature in good shape and the markets were well supplied with seasonable produce. Grain harvest and threshing are completed in most sections. Fall plowing is also under way. Prune picking and packing made rapid progress and apples are ripening nicely and picking started.

Notes from the Field Gooding, Gooding county: Third cutting of alfalfa now starting in favorable localities, but will average very light and some will be watered; wheat yields not as good as last year; very few potatoes in this section. Rupert, Minidoka Co.: Weather cool; some frost did slight damage to beans, tomatoes and corn; harvesting good progress. Weiser, Washington County: Very dry; potatoes and apples picking now in progress; prunes will be cleaned up this week; corn ripening and showing very satisfactory yield.

Idaho Falls, Bonneville county: Cool with frost and snow the first of week; yielding up last of wheat harvesting and threshing progressing; seed peas about harvested; potatoes and beets doing well. Richfield, Lincoln county: First of week cold with some frost; late part warmer; irrigation water all gone and ground drying rapidly; threshing of grain about completed; some excellent yields reported.

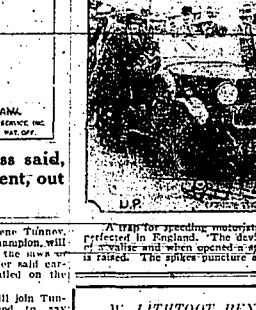
