HOOVER TO MAKE STRONG BID FOR NEW YORK STATE

Speech at Madison Square Garden to Be Biggest Fair of Campaign.

TICKETS WILL BE ISSUED FOR \$25.00

Managers Have Told Him He Has Excellent Chance to Win Empire State.

WASHINGTON, Oct. 3 (AP)—J. Edgar Hoover is planning to make his New York speech Oct. 22—the biggest affair of his republican presidential campaign since his speech of acceptance in the Stanford, Calif., hotel.

Over a two-day time over a national roundup are being planned, and Charles E. Hughes, republican candidate of 1924, has been invited to make a speech.

Plan on \$5,000. Tickets will be issued for \$25.00 per person who is invited to be accommodated in Madison Square Garden, and loud speakers will be placed outside the garden wall to carry the overflow.

Ed Edmund MacLeod, republican state chairman, will preside and will introduce both Hughes and Hoover.

Extraordinary arrangements are being made because Hoover's speech here has an excellent chance to carry the state and he wants to do all he can to help to that end.
