Government Fears Low Wages May Result in Trend to Communism

BERLIN, Oct. 22 (UP)—Industrial unrest is growing in Europe. Business is poor, crops have been fairly good, but the striking people, restless and dissatisfied, face a hard winter.

Recent strikes and lock-outs in Germany, Poland and Czechoslovakia are not accidental phenomena but the direct result of living wages being too low.

It is particularly noticeable in Germany, where the owners' general demands of the week are being whittled down, which certainly would not do it.

Government is fearful. The underlying causes are economic, but the social and political consequences may begin to be felt at any time.

The owners claim that German industry is unable to pay higher wages because of the depression.

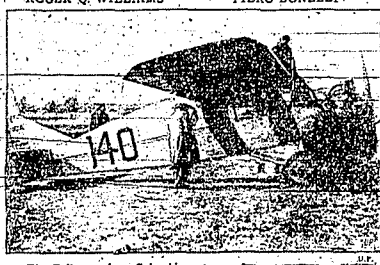

After completing his law course at the University of Virginia, carrying on until graduation despite a physical breakdown, Woodrow Wilson opened a law office in Atlanta, Ga. He found that he was more interested in the study of government than the practice of law. So in 1883 he entered Johns Hopkins University in Baltimore from which he was to receive the degree of Doctor of Philosophy.

In 1885 Wilson married Miss Ellen Axson and they moved to Boston, Mass. He also taught at Connecticut Wesleyan and in 1890 was called to Princeton.

At Princeton Wilson was a vigorous government-writer books and magazine articles, lectured and had a wide influence in university affairs.

He advocated many reforms and serious differences arose between Wilson and the faculty and trustees. While he was carrying on as professor of New Jersey the faculty he was nominated for governor of New Jersey in 1910 and triumphantly elected. He was mentioned as candidate for president, but many party leaders feared his independence.
