Chief Executive Asks Observance of Armistice Day

President H. C. Calhoun has issued a proclamation Thursday asking that Monday, November 11, be observed as Armistice Day.

The proclamation in full reads: "This year the eleventh of November, Armistice Day, falls on Monday and, since the history of the state of Idaho makes it possible that a local holiday (other than the day of the state) may be observed on this day."

"I have, therefore, I, H. C. Calhoun, by the authority vested in me by the constitution of Idaho, do hereby proclaim Monday, November 11, 1928, as a holiday to be observed in each schoolhouse of Armistice Day."

"While the observance of Armistice Day is a national observance, it is the duty of every citizen of Idaho to observe it as a day of remembrance of the sacrifices made by our country and our people in the great struggle of 1914-1918."

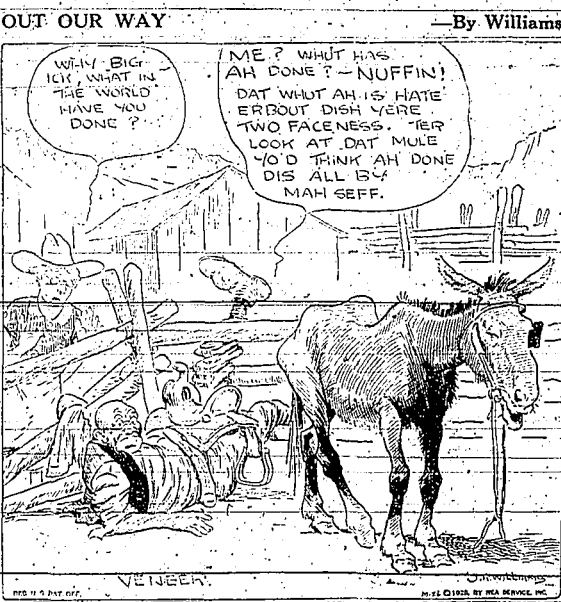
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After the Armistice was signed, President Wilson attended the Peace conference in Paris and took part in drawing up the Versailles treaty.

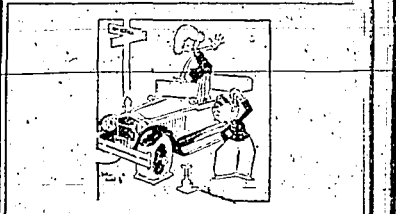
