**ONE WAY TO STOP IT**

ONE of the most convincing arguments yet advanced for permanent forest-land-ownership rests through the public and private lands is the statement by the United States forest service that there was a loss of \$33,000,000 from fires in the forests of the nation last year.

**CHAIN FARMING**  
(Christian Science Monitor)

AS MUCH as one may wish, it is seemingly impossible to keep the industrial structure of the world as it is, with its separate and distinct. One of the latest authorities to join the two issues is Robert S. Brookings, an educator of considerable prominence, who is now engaged in directing an independent agency for economic research in Washington, D. C. Mr. Brookings has consented to be published in pamphlet form some views he has recently submitted to the daily press. In this he gives a more complete and extended account of his views on the subject than has hitherto been available.

**Chain Farming**

Briefly, Mr. Brookings proposes to apply to agriculture the practices of industry. He would establish agricultural operations upon a businesslike basis, even to the point of incorporating properties and farming equipment. In some instances, he believes, it might be well to extend the "chain store" idea to farming and have corporations engaged in managing agricultural operations upon a string of small farms. Such an industrialization of farm operations, according to Mr. Brookings, would tend to reduce the cost of producing farm products and thereby save the consumers of the country from any probability of being burdened with increased costs of foodstuffs.

In the promotion of such a scheme of farm "retail," however, Mr. Brookings runs into some of the same difficulties which have today been experienced by industry. The man anti-trust law prohibits combinations in restraint of trade among the several states. Industrialized agriculture might prove successful, did not the projected agricultural "corporations" run counter to the anti-trust statutes. Manifestly, from a purely economic point of view, the remedy proposed would be a good one if there were any assurance of its successful application. In numerous business enterprises, however, it is not the law that is the chief barrier, but the department of justice and the federal trade-commission have not been inclined to permit their application.

It has on about a hundred years since the first state in the American union authorized the incorporation of business associates. During the last 50 years the most intensive growth of corporations has been witnessed in the United States. These have successfully weathered the storm of criticism that has been during all these years, been leveled at them. Corporate opportunity, corporate advantages and subservience to public welfare have been especially demonstrated. Although authorized by law, corporations have not been especially commended by administrators of the government. Instead, the only federal statute of regulatory importance has dealt solely with the extraneous aspects involved. The anti-trust statutes have, according to the defenders of corporate welfare, outlived their usefulness, and on all sides the demand is being made for their revision or complete overhauling. This, it would seem, is necessary before the Brookings suggestion for farm aid can receive serious consideration.

With the endorsement of notoriety throughout the country, a similar measure will be introduced at the next session of congress, which convenes in December, and every resource will be thrown behind this legislation in an effort to insure its passage, it is said.

"Sound business judgment," says an A. A. A. statement, "demands that the government provide a sum equal to only about one-tenth of this gigantic national land and protect more than 600,000,000 feet of standing timber.

This phase of the situation alone would justify the appropriation, but the importance of connecting up main trunk lines between the east and west is also a matter deserving of immediate attention.

The national motoring body says that speeding up of road construction in the public land study is sorely needed, since the federal government has failed to see that highway improvement on its land keeps pace with that in adjoining states.

The statement continues:

"Western motorists have long been resentful at the failure of congress to provide funds for building roads through the public land areas. The fact that these areas are untaxable and located in sections where there are few automobiles has given them just reason for such an attitude.

"When the federal government assumes its fair share of this burden, transcontinental motor travel will be expedited, development of surrounding areas will proceed and timber resources will be protected for future generations.

"Only the situation is that America is offering the world a splendid example of government urging precaution after having refused to provide protection.

"Losses from forest fires represent a waste and resources that will affect not only the present generation, but future generations of Americans as well."
