Washington, with a number of conference championships in its trophy chest, has lost its two important starts this year and is demoralized by the weight team Coach Burshaw has turned out at the husky institution.

Pop Warner's Cardinals have led a string of champions in their drive to another conference title.

Warner's offense—built on the timing of intricate plays, successful transference of power and fine-back field reserves—are adequate to carry the Cardinals through almost any kind of misfortune. Saturday against Fresno his second and third string backfield, through difficult reserves with the protection of his regulars.

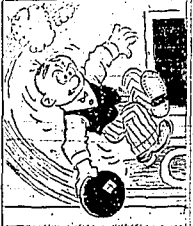

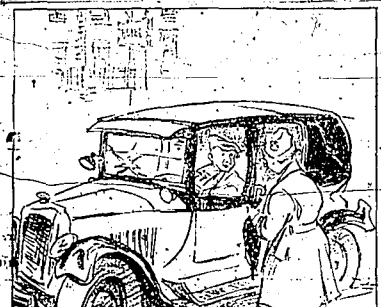

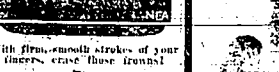
