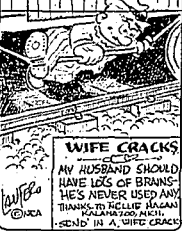

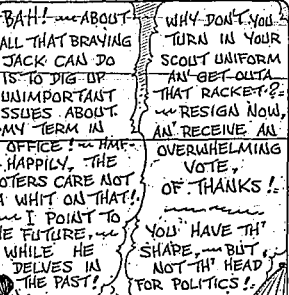

PRICES FOR FARM PRODUCTS DROP

Government Survey Shows Potatoes, Livestock, Wool, in Slump

WASHINGTON, Oct. 31 (AP)—Prices for farm products took a decided slump during the last month, according to survey made public today by the agriculture department. The government price index dropped four points from September 15 to October 15, and is 137, compared with a year-earlier price index of 140. It was two points below 1927.

Reduced prices of livestock, wheat, corn and potatoes were chiefly responsible for the decline, it was stated. Hogs dropped 15 per cent in price during the month while there was a three per cent decrease in beef cattle prices. Both declines were attributed to increased market receipts.

Corn prices declined sharply despite a decline of 20 cents a bushel that was anticipated in September, the department said. The reduction has been accompanied by reports that the 1928 crop is of higher than average merchantable quality.

Wheat prices turned slightly upward in October after a sustained price decline from May to September. It is an advance of 2 per cent in farm prices from September 15 to October 15 being fairly general throughout the country. The farm price increases were accompanied by indications of a greater demand for wheat on account of reports of short wheat crops in Russia, Turkey and South China and short corn crops in the Balkan countries.

Department advices today told indications of a favorable increase in this year's Australian wheat crop.

Potatoes on October 15 dropped to the lowest price on record for 13 years. The farm price was 65 cents per bushel compared with 65 cents on September 15, and 55 cents in October, 1915.

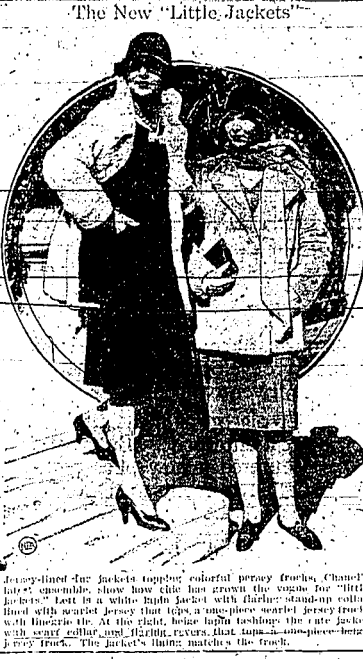
