Wealth Is Gone and List of Dead Shows That Some Evil Is at Work.

one's feet being carried off by persons unknown for ransom, even though unknown.



It is a pity, however, for a naturally healthy body to become cramped and fatigued by mental worries. But sure as fate, it will be unless you develop that fighting spirit and determination to ride down your cares.

We may argue over the relative importance of physical and mental health. We may say the dismised mind is responsible always for the diseased body—but may not the body be responsible for ordinary common sense? Should we not us that even that can't be denied? We cannot afford to harbor unnecessary worries. They have the way for physical ill.
