BEARS AND CARDS WILL DETERMINE SUCCESS OF YEAR

Athletic Leaders Of Country Plan For Championships

SEASONS NET OBTAINABLE FOR BIGGEST GAME IN THE WEST FOR WEEK OF NOV. 19 TO 24.

SAN FRANCISCO, Nov. 19 (AP)—The big game which, regardless of the Pacific coast's football coaches, will largely determine the success or failure of the 1928 football season for University of California and Stanford, today occupied the thoughts of far western fans.

It was reported that the University of California was forced to return unfilled orders from Stanford for seats in the Berkeley Memorial stadium next Saturday. The weekend games did little to the status of the conference and the University of California's hope on Stanford and California.

In a slump The Cardinals were shown in their 12 to 0 victory over Washington, to be still suffering from an unexplained slump. The Bears demonstrated a better second team routed about by the University of Nevada for a 60 to 0 victory.

The University of Southern California Trojans moved another notch toward the conference championship by defeating Washington State, 27 to 13.

The state battle in Oregon saw the University of Oregon defeat Oregon State 12 to 0.

Have Good Chance For the first time in years, the Bears of U. C. today were accorded a good chance of winning the annual western classic from Stanford.

The Bears' main line is yet untried by a collegiate team and all school teams in U. C. has not been defeated, with the exception of U. S. C. The Bears Trojans play a 10 to 0.

The Trojans also have a clean record and should Stanford win, on a basis of comparative scores California is stronger. After the Bears and Trojans had played their game the Trojans defeated the Cardinals 10 to 0.

To better the Stanford legend however, is the wizardry of "Pop" Warner, who is certain to bring out surprise after surprise on the way.

NEW YORK, Nov. 19 (AP)—More than 200 amateur athletic leaders and all universities of the country attended the opening of the fourth annual convention of the Amateur Athletic Union today at the Waldorf Astoria hotel. The convention will close tomorrow.

The award of the national championships, proposed amendments to the constitution and applications for new records occupied the every attention of the delegates.

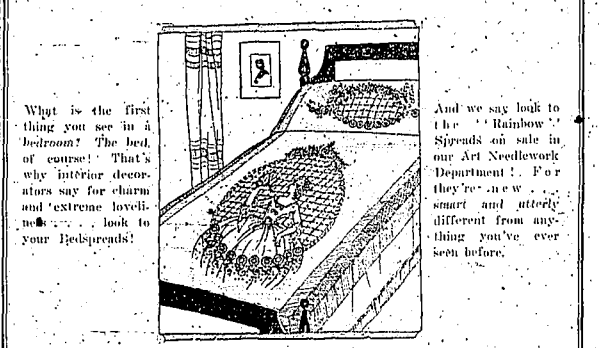

SCIENTISTS KEEP DOG HEAD ALIVE FOR THREE HOURS

Swallows Food and Drinks Though Cut From Body and Declared Dead.

MOSCOW, Nov. 19. (AP)—Soviet scientists, through a series of laboratory experiments, claim to have kept a dog's head alive for three hours after it was cut from its body to which it once had been attached. The dog's head, packed with pain and pleasure, although its sound issued, the vocal power having been severed. It opened and closed its eyes, which were as sensitive in light and touch as any other dog's.

Swallows Food
The dog's head even swallowed food, despite the fact there was no stomach for it to go into. The experiment was accomplished by the use of an "artificial heart" an intricate apparatus of steel and rubber which pumped blood to the head. The blood, incidentally, was the same which in the head pumped to the rest of the body.

Artificially Circulated Blood
This artificial circulation of blood, which opens new vistas to the scientific world, is one of the experiments by which biologists and physiologists of the Soviet Union expect to establish the possibility of resuscitating dead organisms. It was conducted by Dr. S. Burdakov and his associates at the Moscow Scientific Chemical Institute.

Now Accomplished
After administering an anesthetic, the dog's head was severed carefully so as not to injure any important blood vessels and nerves in the neck. The blood from the entire body had been pumped out previously and kept from coagulating by means of chemical preparations. The artificial heart then was attached to the open blood vessels and blood sent coursing through the head that seemed completely dead. Immediately there were signs of life. Full consciousness, however, did not return until the effects of the anesthetic had worn off. Thereafter the head responded.

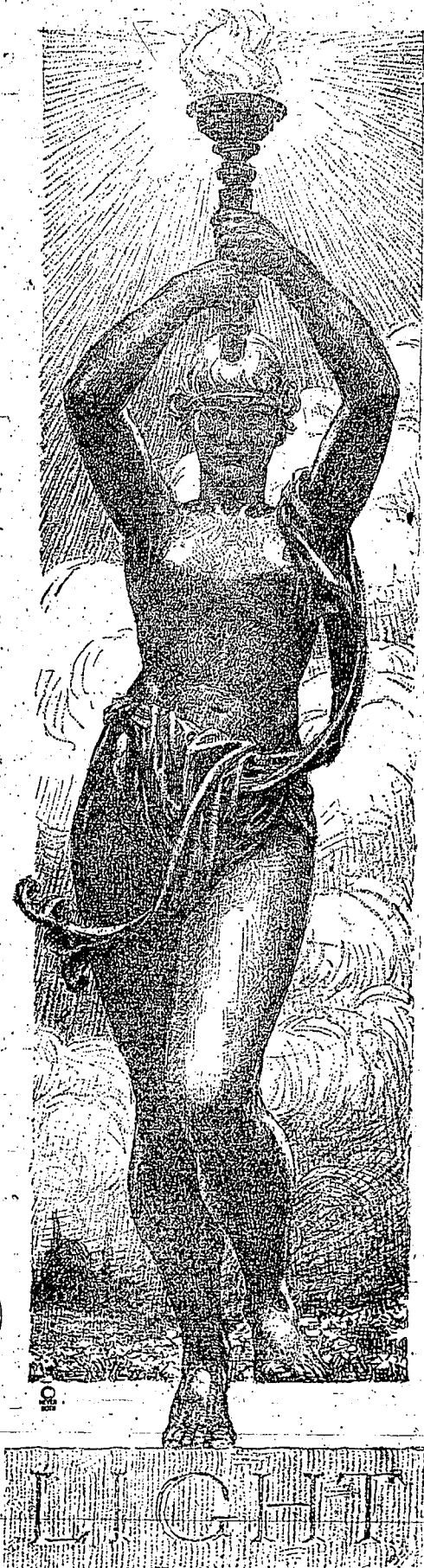

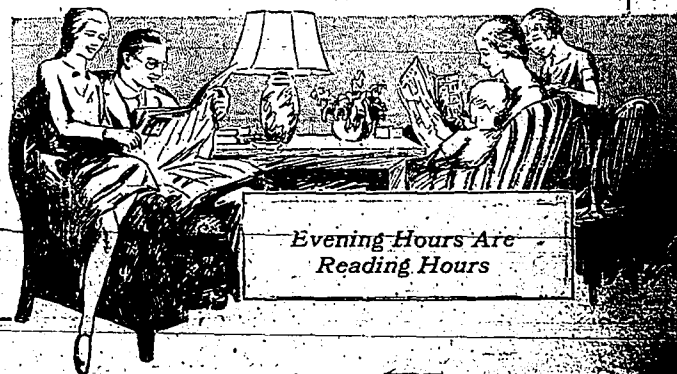
