THARPE WAS ATTACKED CLAIM DEFENSE

GAME WARDEN HAS FRESH TALE ABOUT ATTACK AT BOISE

R. E. Thomas—Claims Shields Knows More Than He Is Telling.

TRIED TO AMBUSH ONE OF PARTNERS

Webb's Hiding Place Known by Man in Custody, Is Now Claimed.

HOISe, Nov. 22 (UPI)—A fresh version of the "ambush" attack on Idaho's state game warden, by poachers, was reported today by State Game Warden R. E. Thomas.

Thomas said that Earl Shibley, partner in the county jail here and his pal, Dee Webb, still are fugitives, but only attacked Webb with a club, and threatened to shoot him if he did not leave. They also lied in ambush waiting to murder J. B. Howard, their young companion, who became frantic.

Thomas said Malone and Illegally trapping beaver, he said that both drew guns, placed the poachers under arrest, and sent them to his camp. There, Warden Thomas secured a club three inches thick; got his gun and knife ready, and waited for the two outlaws to return. Howard ran into some nearby brush to escape and met a bullet.

Student Admits That He Shot Gun but Says: "I Didn't Mean to Kill Anybody."

BIRMINGHAM, Ala., Nov. 22 (UPI)—A "hair-clipping" feud between students at the University of Alabama, at Tuscaloosa, has resulted in the confessed murder of Monroe Freeman, 22-year-old Birmingham Southern football player, and the wounding of another junior student at Howard.

God, know, I didn't mean to kill anybody," I just had the urge to clip him, said a co-conspirator, Harry, adding that Freeman led an expedition of Birmingham-Southern students to the "ring" where he worked, planned to clip his hair.

Six students in each college have been "clipped" by groups of students at the "ring" since the feud started a year ago.



YOUR CHILDREN

I have been asked what I consider the greatest cause of colds. There is no "greatest cause." There is the war. Almost anything and everything can cause a cold, the patient is ready to have one.

And like war, what may cause trouble in one place wouldn't distract another in the long run. We have had many children having so few colds. Every thing went beautifully one winter. Not even a case of what I call "the permanent bronchitis" that one of the girls had been fond of giving us girls!

But the first fall? Scarcely was the October leaf on the calendar when we started getting colds. It was niggled. I had felt a draft at the head of the bed was an insidious wall. I had put a plenty of fresh air two windows open and the door open in the room. Certain ways fixed the ventilation there was no draft. But again there was "the only draft" in the room that caught the draft at the wall at the head of the beds.

Just such little things cause colds, that's why I suggest that you have a plenty of fresh air all around for the children, and for older children the heads of the beds should have a check made on them to prevent the drafts. Drafts are terrible.

See that the children are covered well at night, shoulders and feet. I used to buy big horse-blankets and hardware stores to get the covers to roll down, down. Ordinary safety pins would pull open. Or sew tapes on the edges won't tear and the thus in the shape of the head.

If your children's sleeping rooms are very cold and they have this trouble, I'd put little light weight coats on them at night.


And see that the children don't dress in a cold room. That is very necessary.
