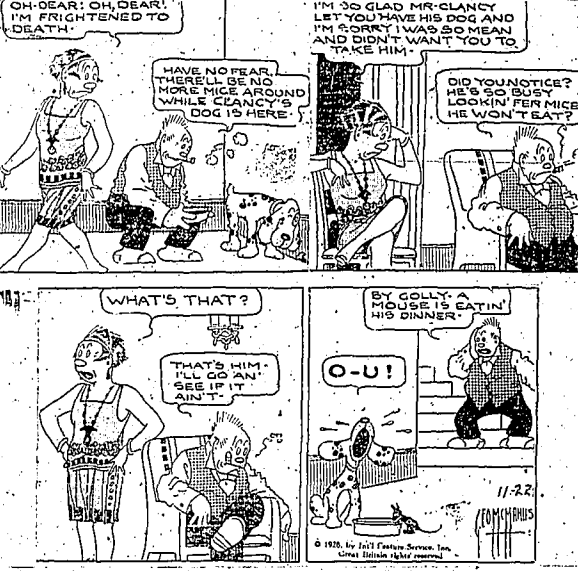
WESTERN RECLAMATION IS INSPIRING (Spokesman Review)
