### OUR LITTLE CAPITAL

VERY often during the course of the year Boise performs in such a manner as to first provoke, and then amuse, Twin Falls. The manner in which the capital city has apparently forgotten the fact that Twin Falls has suffered from the ill effects of two epidemics, first influenza, then meningitis, preventive on the face of things but really amusing in the final analysis, is an example.

Press associations have carried hysterical stories on the local situation, largely due to the influence of Boise as capital of the state and point of origin of much of the publicity. The epidemics here have been overplayed by the news; by Boise, and at the same time the capital city press has been careful to prevent a true impression of the influenza epidemic within its own borders from becoming epidemic by the state at large.

Who knows a lady who has grown children in both Twin Falls and Boise? The last time between the two cities. The other day she decided to go to Boise. Due to the fact that horribly distorted news stories have given Twin Falls a reputation as the selected dwelling place of death she thought it advisable and courteous to telephone relatives in Boise to ascertain whether they would like her to have her visit there. What she discovered was that a daughter who works in a store was the only sales person in the store not ill. In the other family she usually visits every member was ill.

"Don't come to Boise if you want to keep safe," her own daughter informed her. "Somebody else is sick now with the flu."

Boise was an old town before the city of Twin Falls was born, but the younger city has had a remarkable growth. Situated as it is in the most fertile agricultural land in Idaho and known as the Magic City, it has gained fame and prestige for its progress and speed. Every rung of the ladder that Twin Falls has climbed for some reason or another explained to our satisfaction, has torn the heart of Boise with virulent envy.

That envy and jealousy find expression in the oddest forms, as witness the most recent example. In this Christian era we believe the admiration that would only to such a situation is that we weep with those who weep and rejoice with those who rejoice. Boise has been weeping tears in our behalf, but we can not shake the conviction that their position is pleasurable.

Being human, or composed of human blood, Twin Falls enjoys real sympathies. Boise never yet in our memory has been able to extend its any except left-handed compliments. She strikes as when she finds us down and is apt to other dramatic tricks, cultivated by aged fighters who have lost the punch and courage of youth.

Sometimes we are provoked by this scolding behavior. Then our sense of humor rushes to one's aid and helps us strike a balance of real values. It is not to be expected that Twin Falls and should have some prestige by reason of being the state capital. When a man weighing 250 pounds goes out of his way to stir up trouble with one weighing 125 pounds it can usually be determined that the big fellow has either lost his courage and is scared to death that the little fellow is growing two feet, or else he never did have the intellectual fortitude to fight after the fashion white men use if a fight must be held.

### HOUGHTON GOES BACK

It is good to learn that Alvin H. Houghton is resuming his post as American ambassador to Great Britain. Mr. Houghton early in the summer offered his resignation, effective at the president's pleasure, in order to run for United States senator in New York. He was defeated, now Mr. Coolidge has prevailed on him to reconsider, and he returns to London as our envoy.

His service in that capacity has been distinguished. He sees international problems, particularly the problems centering about disarmament and world peace, with unusual clarity and common sense. The country is the gainer by his decision to resume his post.

### DANCING TO THE POLLS

IT takes all kinds of votes—and voters—to make an election. In Springfield, Ill., on election day, one of those marvellous dances in progress, the county precincts decided to vote anyway. So they danced up to a truck, were driven to a polling place, danced in, jiggled about while marking their ballots, then danced back to the truck and were carried, still jiggling, back to the dance floor.

Imagine how the nation would have suffered if it had failed to get the vote of these intelligent citizens on the great issues of the day!

### Best Editorial of the Day

#### PEACE BECOMES POPULAR!

(Christian Science Monitor)

A STRANGE thing has happened. Talking peace is now regarded as a political virtue. It was not always so. There used to be candidates for public office scrupulously avoided discussing the practical phases of the peace question. There never was any lack in political campaigns of that fulsome and meaningless eulogy of peace in the abstract. But when it came to a concrete framing of the concrete measures through which peace was to be achieved, there was only silence in the camp of the contenders for public preference.

The idea of the outlawry of war was once repudiated by political spokesmen as heartlessly visionary. The early sponsors of the movement to delegatize war were dubbed "pacifists" and "theorists." They were said to be impractical for even suggesting that a sovereign nation should forego its ancient right to make war. What a change has taken place in these few intervening years! The signing of the Paris peace pact in the capital city of the French republic on August 27, and the subsequent endorsing of this treaty by the diplomatic bodies of practically every civilized nation of the world, not only represents a tremendous interest among the people in the quest for peace, but registers the acceptance among politicians and statesmen of those ideas which only a few years ago were spurned as being wholly without practical merit.

Furthermore, the movement in contemporary peace as well as man's general attitude of ontological emergency was confined, for some years, to a relatively small group of men and women. It was felt by these persons that the likelihood of war would be reduced to a minimum if the financial profits accruing from wartime industrial activities were to be completely swept by the state. No objection prevailed among the politicians as to the desirability and the practicality of such a proposal. That the logic and the moral soundness of this proposition made such a convincing appeal to public thought that the politicians who first scented the idea are now supporting it.

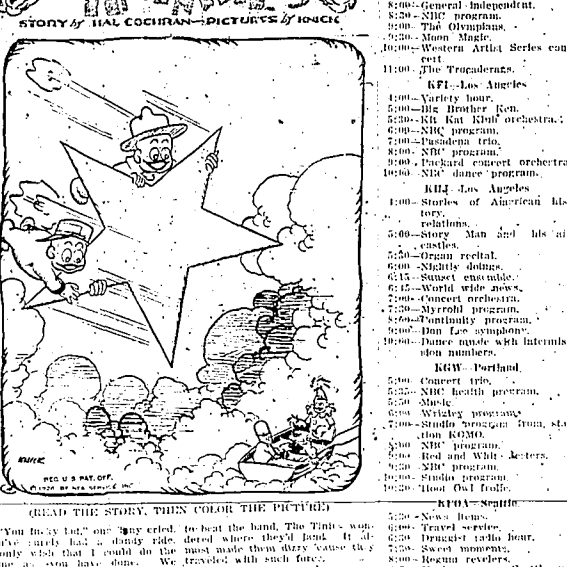

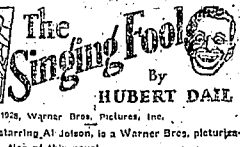

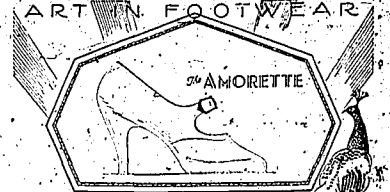
