

HANSEN, Dec. 8 (Special) — The boys of the football team who will receive their letters in a few days from John Hansen, President of Hansen, John Gilley, Leonard Hall, Clarence LaCombe, Lester Nayor, Sam Glenn, Ray Pennington, Guy Lovell, Tom Hill, Ken Taylor, Sylvan Hill, Clinton Kipp, Schuppi. The letters are of white with a small faint blue in one corner and are written on green paper. The letters are also heavily striped upon the sleeves, one stripe major for each year to serve upon the team.


