He is bound to check the practice of flooding roads with waste water in his district and he has the solid support of the public in his attempt to en-force the law. The man who deliberitely turns his water into the road it as it should be disposed of should be made to pay for his indifference.
The people are telerant. They will
give an offender all the latitude to
which he is entitled, and more. In 99 per cent of the offenses, a few minmore with a shovel would provent damage to the road. Every road in the county has chuck boles and mirey anots due to flooding and every erseer should file a complaint against every man guilty of negli-gence in this respect. John Peters has set the pace and it is up to others fall in line or confess their lnabil-

In connection with the proposed bond issue for the erection of a court house in Twin Falls county, it is well to consider in detail the various kinds of bonds and the cost of their redemp tion. What is commonly known as the "10-20" bond matures in 20 years with the privilege of redemption at the expiration of 10 years, or refund-ing. This is the kind of bond that the county would in all probability issue in the event that the taxpayers decide premium of not less than 2 per cent premium of not less than 2 per cent. For the first 10 years the interest only is payable. This would entail an annual outlay of \$7,500, which would necessitate a tax of a trille less than two mills on an assessed valuation of \$4,000,000. It would mean an annual expense of 90 cents to the transport of form to a taxpayer owning 40 acres of farm to a taxpayer owning to acres of tarm land, assessed at \$12 per acre, assuming that the assessed valuation did not increase, which is a ridiculous assumption. During the elevanth year, in the ovent that the bonds are not refunded, the interest on the entire amount and one-tenth of the principal must be secured. As the honds are issued in denominations of \$500 each, 30 of them, aggregating in value \$15,000, would be retired during the eleventh year, and the interest on this amount would be stopped. In 11 years time it is absolutely safe to predict that the assessed valuation of Twin Falls county will exceed \$12,000,000. That valuation is in plain sight. Every acre under the Twin Falls and Salmon canal systems will have been patent ed by that time and even though the Salmon tract were not doubled in area, as it unquestionably will be, the patented land alone will bring the assessed valuation of the county to \$12,000,000, not counting the improve menta. A tax of one-half mill would wipe out the bonds after the principal payments become due, or a burden of less than 25 cents per year on a tax-payer owning, 40 acres. These fig-ures are very conservative and show conclusively what the county is undertaking.
