Misuse of Patronage.



Petitions are being circulated for the removal of the United States land office from Halley to Shoshone for the reason that the latter town is more central for those who have land business to transact. The change of location is made necessary by the development in the southern part of what is now the Halley district, which was a desert when the district was created. Citizens of Twin Falls county who have business with the United States land department are obliged to lose three or four days in going to Halley, whereas they could visit Shoshone in a day. The construction of the Milner-Gooding electric railway will bring Shoshone nearer to Twin Falls in point of time, consequently the people of this county are deeply interested in the proposed change, which would be decidedly to their advantage. Except during the summer months, the citizens of Custer county are obliged to go to Halley by rail, via Red Rock, and it would be cheaper and quicker for them to do their land business in Shoshone. The same applies to Custer county. The citizens of Elmore would not be discommoded by the change, which would be welcomed by those who live in the southern part of the district. Petitions will be sent to Twin Falls county for signature and they should bear the name of every taxpayer in the county.

purify of the water. The Twin Falls Water-works company has been an important factor in the upbuilding of the city. Twin Falls, however, seems to be outgrowing the company's facilities. People are building homes and are demanding water service which the company appears to be unwilling or unable to furnish. Water users are objecting to the quality of the supply, which might be improved by filtration. The pressure is uncertain. It is urged that there is too much friction in the wooden mains and that the system of distribution is inadequate. If the company is unable to remedy the alleged defects in its system, it should join hands with the city in providing Twin Falls with a water supply commensurate with local requirements. of private monopoly, shall be added to, not substituted for, state remedies.

tariff. We welcome the belated promise of tariff reform now offered by the Republican party in latest recognition of the righteousness of the Democratic position on this question; but the people cannot surely entrust the execution of this important work to a party which is so deeply obligated to the injury-protection interests as the Republican party. We call attention to the significant fact that the promised relief was postponed until after the coming election—no election since which the Republican party must have that same support from the beneficiaries of the high protective tariff as it has always heretofore received from them; and to the further fact that during years of uninterrupted power, no action whatever has been taken by the Republican congress to correct the admittedly existing tariff inequities.

We favor immediate revision of the tariff by the reduction of import duties. Articles entering into competition with trust-controlled products should be placed upon the free list and material reductions should be made in such other schedules as may be necessary to restore the tariff to a revenue basis.

Existing duties have given the manufacturers of paper a shelter behind which they have organized combinations to raise the price of pulp and of paper, thus imposing a tax upon the general knowledge.

We demand the immediate repeal of the tariff on wood pulp, print paper, lumber, timber and logs and that these articles be placed upon the free list.

Railroad Regulation. We assert the right of congress to exercise complete control over interstate commerce and the right of each state to exercise control over commerce within its borders.

We demand such enlargement of the powers of the interstate commerce commission as may be necessary to compel carriers to perform their duties as common carriers and prevent discrimination and extortion.

We favor the efficient supervision and rate regulation of railroads engaged in interstate commerce. To this end we recommend the valuation of railroads by the interstate commerce commission, such valuation to take into consideration the physical value of the property, original cost of reproduction and all elements of value that will render the valuation simple fair and just.

We favor such legislation as will prohibit the railroad from engaging in business which brings them into competition with their shipments, also legislation which will assure such reduction in transportation rates as conditions will permit, care being taken to prevent such reduction from compelling a reduction of wages, prevent adequate service or do injustice to legitimate investments. We heartily approve the laws prohibiting the pass and the rebate, and we favor any further necessary legislation to restrain, correct and prevent such abuses.

We favor such legislation as will increase the power of the interstate commerce commission, giving it the initiative with reference to rates and transportation charges put into effect by railroad companies, and permitting the interstate commerce commission, on its own initiative, to declare a rate illegal and as being more than should be charged for such service. That the interstate commerce commission be without power to require the railroad to file its rates and to have them made a part of the public law relating thereto is inadequate by reason of the fact that the interstate commerce commission is without power to require the railroad to file its rates and to have them made a part of the public law relating thereto.

We further declare that all increments of traffic or other associations or rate-making agencies affecting interstate rates, rates or classifications, shall be subject to review and approval by the interstate commerce commission.

We favor the enactment of a law giving to the interstate commerce commission the power to issue improved freight tariff rates or schedules before they shall take effect, and if they be found to be unreasonable, to initiate an adjustment thereof.

Banking.

The plan of not coming without any legitimate reason when the Republican party has for a decade been in complete control of the federal government, furnishes additional proof that it is either unwilling or incapable to protect the interests of the general public. It has so filled the country to Wall street that the sites of the associations are visited upon the whole people. While refusing to repeal the wealth producers' trust legislation at the hands of the stock gamblers and speculators in farm products, it has created treasury funds without interest and without competition, in favor of banks. It has used an emergency for which it is largely responsible to force through congress a bill which the banks of this country are having market manipulation, and has failed to give to the 12,000,000 depositors of the country protection in their savings.

We believe that in so far as the needs of emergency require an emergency currency, such currency should be issued, controlled by the federal government and loaned on adequate security to national and state banks. We pledge ourselves to legislation under which national banks shall be required to establish a guaranteed fund for the prompt payment of the liabilities of any insolvent national bank under an equitable system which shall be available to all banking institutions wishing to use it.

We favor a postal savings bank if the guaranteed fund cannot be secured and that it be constituted so as to keep the deposited money in the communities where it is established. But we condemn the policy of the Republican party in providing postal savings banks under a plan of conduct by which they will receive the deposits of rural communities and re-deposit the same in the banks of Wall street, thus doubling the circulating medium of the producing region and unjustly favoring the speculative markets.

Trusts.

A private monopoly is indefensible and intolerable. We therefore favor the vigorous reform of the criminal law against guilty trust managers and officials and demand the enactment of such additional legislation as may be necessary to make it impossible for a private monopoly to exist in the United States. Among the additional reforms we especially favor are: first, a law preventing a duplication of directors among competing corporations; second, a license system which will, without abolishing the right of each state to create corporations, or its right as granted as will force corporations using business within its limits, unless it necessary for manufacturing or trading corporation engaged in interstate commerce to take out a federal license before it shall be permitted to control as much as 25 per cent of the product in which it deals; the license to protect the public from watered stock and to prohibit the control by such corporation of more than 20 per cent of the total amount of any product consumed in the United States; and third, a law compelling such licensed corporations to sell to all purchasers in all parts of the country on the same terms, after making due allowance for cost of transportation.

We favor an income tax as part of our revenue system, and we urge the submission of a constitutional amendment specifically authorizing congress to levy and collect tax upon individual and corporate incomes, to the end that wealth may be distributed more equitably among the citizens of the federal government.

The courts of justice are the backbone of our liberties, and we wish to see our purpose to maintain their dignity, our liberty and the law in the hands of distinguished judges, who have high regard and confidence in which their decisions must be judicially maintained. We request the attention of the legislative body to this fact, and in respect to the judiciary, it is an unjust reflection upon the great body of our citizens.
