Congressman French will have something to explain to his constituents in this state as the result of his vote against the resolution supporting President Wilson's Mexican policy. Congressman French should remember that first of all he is sworn to support the government and that his allegiance to his party is not the loyalty which counts. In the coming election Burton L. French should be made to remember that Idaho is loyal to the flag and that the Mexican trouble is not a partisan one, but a test of the worth of the flag which every true American loves and respects. If for no other reason, Mr. French should bring a reprimand by the voters in the coming primaries. He should serve the nation and the state and not his party. One of the greatest surprises to the people of this nation in the attitude of many congressmen and senators in their quibbling over backing the president. Not a single patriot in this country desires war, but there are those when force must be used to stop insolence and studied dishonesty to the American flag. Congress cannot have anything but contempt for this country if the policy advanced by Idaho congressmen is to double the debt of one of our national assemblies, each \$200,000,000.

due the much larger combined forces. Such action also has a sinister look with possibly much behind it to complicate the adjudication of Mexico. It does not seem possible that the Villa would stake his chances for success under protection of this country, unless some strong promises have been made by certain powers who have large interests in Mexico. Villa's insubordination toward this country may have a stronger foundation than is generally credited and may be due to overtures made to him which have not shown on the surface. German manufacturers have been furnishing very important information when it is generally known that the provisional government faces bankruptcy. Germany's aggressive foreign policy may be lack of such action on the part of that nation's commercial interests. At any rate this country faces a problem which at any time may become serious by reason of the foreign owners' holdings in Mexico. The killing of foreigners or destruction of their property is possible during the trouble which will follow a declaration of war and such accidents will be treated seriously by the powers of the Monroe Doctrine. There does not appear a shadow-ray of hope for early justification under the present conditions and this country must face the problem from the very outset.

A RIDICULOUS PROPOSAL. The country has been favored of late with disconcerting evidence of the ignorance of some members of congress on the subject of our navy. Lack of elementary knowledge in such high quarters on matters of grave national import is greatly to be regretted, and when it is added the fact that these ignorantly made and adopted of an active spirit of hostility, the situation becomes deplorable. It was only recently that a certain senator proposed a certain amendment to our navy as a condition of "good will" - without understanding what it is in any way to the honorable profession attacked as it is dishonorable to his honor.

And now comes Senator Weeks with his amazing proposal to place the fast scout cruisers of the navy in service as carriers of mail and freight between New York, New Orleans and the Pacific coast. There is no possible excuse for the introduction on the floor of the senate of such an utterly impractical proposal as this for it is a fact which must be well known to every one of the senators, representatives, congressmen, that there is within a few minutes' reach of the capital at all

times a body of expert advisers, not merely in the navy, but in every other government department, who are not only willing, but very eager to afford all possible technical information and enlightenment on subjects which the members may wish to bring up for discussion, either in the house or the senate. If Senator Weeks had taken the trouble to consult the secretary of the technical advisers of the secretary, he would have been instantly assured that to use naval vessels for the transport of mail and freight was a proposition impossible from every point of view.

In the first place, the transfer of vessels from naval to commercial service would violate one of the very first principles upon which an efficient establishment on subjects which the members may wish to bring up for discussion, either in the house or the senate. If Senator Weeks had taken the trouble to consult the secretary of the technical advisers of the secretary, he would have been instantly assured that to use naval vessels for the transport of mail and freight was a proposition impossible from every point of view.

In these days of watchful conservatism when, as in the case of the German navy, from three fourths to four-fifths of the principal units are maintained in full commission and active service, a decline how may be struck contemporaneously with the declaration of war, or even in anticipation of it. It has always been a characteristic of our foreign policy, and was no more so today, that that we have been reluctant to make any distribution of our military forces which might bear any hostile construction by the nation with whom we conduct diplomatic exchange. Our best service, as we have shown in a recent article, is altogether limited as it is, and were the only three distinctively scout vessels that we possess to be transferred, as Senator Weeks has suggested, to commercial work, it is perfectly conceivable that a sudden declaration of war might find the "Cloister" at Valparaiso, the "Salem" at Buenos Ayres, and the "Birmingham" in the Straits of Malacca.

If Senator Weeks had taken the trouble to inquire, he would have been told that one of the chief difficulties of the naval constructor is to find space for such equipment, stores, bedding, accommodations, fuel, etc., as must be carried by a warship in



It works by every means to guard the people of the state against disease and to increase through education, the health and prosperity of the citizens. HEALTH AND HYGIENE

What the State Board of Health of Idaho Does.

It furnishes literature about the cause and prevention of such contagious diseases, written in plain language so that anyone can understand it.

It furnishes anti-epidemic vaccines in the winter in order that its resources will be available.

If an epidemic occurs in any community, it sends an expert to investigate and recommend means for its prevention. If the local authorities are unable to control the situation, it takes charge of the situation until the epidemic is controlled.

It furnishes to town and county boards of health advice and assistance of any kind without cost.

Its laboratory examines specimens for consumption, typhoid fever, diphtheria, tetanus and other diseases, free of cost, upon request of any physician. Examinations for syphilis are made at cost.



Our 3-year-old fawn were out Sunday afternoon exercising and getting ready for the season's play.




