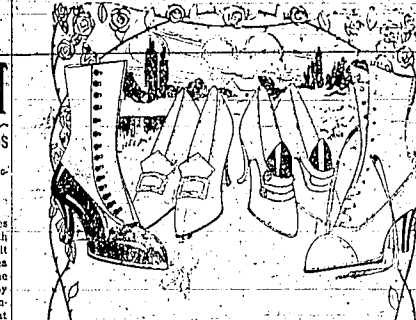

ERADICATE HOG CHOLERA

Resolution Passed

The Mexican trouble has been the all-absorbing matter in congress during the last three or four days. Members of congress are not divided in sentiment on the question of abolishing the United States as against Mexico or backing the president in protecting American honor. They are divided on the best method of doing this.

On Monday when the war resolution was presented in the house, 27 members voted against it. The resolution passed the United States had quietly failed to hold Mexico to account for murder of American citizens, outrage upon women and children, and violation of property, the question of number of states in a nation to the American flag should not be made the subject of war. The department has agreed to cooperate with Idaho in carrying an appropriation of \$25,000 for

the building of such a plant in Idaho for the manufacture of serum. I feel that Dean Carlyle can do much to help the good work along by properly presenting the facts to the department of agriculture.

"B. Supervision of private, and where necessary, state serum plants, so as to prevent the spread of the disease and dangerous serums.

"C. Demonstration and educational work among farmers, cooperative organizations and other interested parties in order to bring about better understanding of the disease and approved methods of combating it. The department proposes to make its own clinic as to which division the work in that particular state shall be carried on.
