MAY BECOME MARKSMEN

Arms and Ammunition Provided Rifle Club Use.

There is one thing which the present Congress has done for which some day this great country will offer praise of praise, as it may be the means of helping our republic to more effectively resist invaders. And all the turmoil and strife which attend the lawmakers have been surpassed only of which the public hears but little and little more and little more what's waiting, there has been quietly passed, an act which will promote and encourage marksmanship among the citizens of the country. If effectively carried out, the results of this legislation once again give a meaning to the long discussed and spoken of in this country: "A nation of marksmen."

Since the civil war and for some time previous to the conflict, marksmanship in this country has seriously declined. No effort was made by the federal government to stimulate rifle instruction among its citizens and very little by the state themselves. In fact the government discouraged them by making almost no provision for citizens to own a military rifle and to defend them of the government ranks. This policy, however, has in the last decade of the war Department of the War Department, largely through the efforts of the National Rifle Association of America, it is now possible for citizens to own rifles and to become marksmen and most state ranges are thrown open to civilized marksmen. To encourage citizens has now authorized the issue of the War Department of rifles and ammunition to properly organized rifle clubs. Anticipating the coming of the National Rifle Association in 1913, there are today 355 active rifle clubs affiliated with the National Rifle Association, which has available for rifle club among civilians, but high school cadet corps and other schools maintaining military instruction can take advantage of the act and draw arms and ammunition for the boys.—Gooding Gazette.
