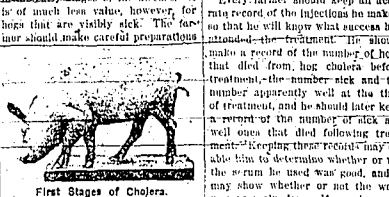


Injecting Cholera Serum Into Hog.

recipients and cover having been sterilized by boiling in water before use. The glass should be allowed to cool before the serum is poured into it, and should always be covered except when serum is being taken from it.
The serum is injected directly into the tissues on the inner side of the thigh or, better, into the loose tissues between the foreleg and the body. The needle is inserted into the skin perpendicular to a depth of from one-half to 1 inch, depending upon the size of the hog. Before the injection is made the skin of the hog over the point selected for injection should be thoroughly cleaned by washing with soap and water, and the surface then scrubbed with some disinfectant...

before beginning the inoculation. Hogs that are sick should be separated from the well and marked so as to distinguish them. The pen or enclosure where the injections are made should be clean and free from dust.
The serum is administered by injecting it deep under the skin with a hypodermic syringe. Intra-venous injections, the injection of a leg, are not to be taken to see that the syringe and needles are not only absolutely clean, but that they have been previously boiled in water for 10 or 15 minutes. The purpose of the boiling is to kill the germs that may be on the instrument. Therefore, both people and syringe should be kept clean and not allowed to become soiled during use. As by being laid on a dry plank dropped on the ground or touched with dirty hands. It is a good idea to spread a clean towel on the plank or table where the work is being done. Before using, the serum should be poured into some receptacle with a cover (as a jelly glass with a tin top), both in...

DOES NOT CAUSE SOIL ACID

Doubtful if Small Amount of Land Plaster Generally Applied Has Any Serious Effect.

The fear that the application of land plaster makes soils acid is unfounded. At least it is doubtful if the small amount generally applied has any serious and immediate influence upon the acidity of the soil.

This is the holder of the Hart of the College of Agriculture of the University of Wisconsin, who from time to time has carried out numerous experiments to determine the influence of applying land plaster, rock phosphate and other fertilizers to fields upon which various crop rotations were followed.

The theory that land plaster applied to soil would make it acid, is based on the assumption that the sulfate removed from the soil more calcium than sulphur, thereby leaving behind a greater percentage of the acid part of the land plaster. On the contrary, it has been shown that the common cereals, wheat, oats, corn, barley and such other plants as the turnip, rutabaga, cabbage and onion, make positively greater demands for sulphur than for calcium and in the case of the application of land plaster would have a tendency toward developing acid soil. "Ordinary use about equal amounts of calcium and sulphur, and land plaster could not possibly influence soil reaction in this case."

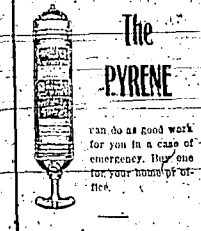
