## CANDIDATES COME FROM THE TIMBER

### A Number File for Primary Race

#### PROGRESSIVES INDICATE DETERMINATION TO FILL TICKET

**Fair Cornered Eight in Twin Falls County Makes Outcome Very Doubtful.**

At least four tickets will appear on the official ballot of Twin Falls county in the primaries, which will be held in September, according to indications. Republicans, Democrats, Socialists and Progressives are all doing their up coming. Following the departure of the candidates from the previous primaries, however, the bondholders that control us in the matter of new rates and competition of the parcel post make it necessary to practice all possible economy consistent with reasonable service.

The fact of the matter is that we overextended ourselves in undertaking a city office in Twin Falls, and may yet find it necessary to discontinue name and to handle our business entirely at the depot as formerly; however, we do not know so far if it will be necessary to do this.

Heads train to work at 12:10 p.m., 5:17 p.m., and 6:40 p.m., makes it necessary to have help at the depot those hours, and, of course, our men must have time for their mid-day meal. We have been told to come into town in the middle of the day or from 11:30 a.m. to 1:30 p.m. you state that, however, is but little more than is ordinarily necessary at such places that it merely necessary to close it a little longer than the usual lunch hour, say an hour and a half, at least at the office for our offices, but according to their custom—will no doubt have a fall ticket in that field.
