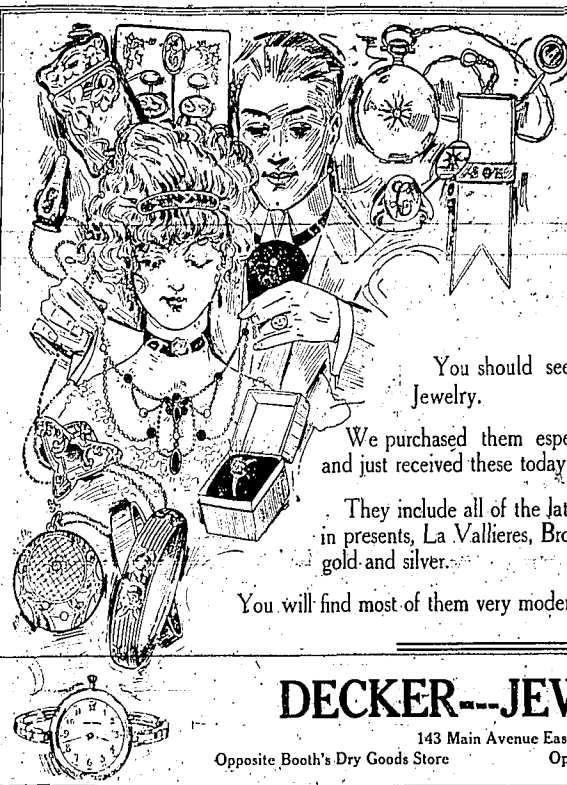

From the prevailing opinion of the press of the state, the public utilities commission will be in for some rough treatment in the coming session of the legislature. Reviews of the acts of the present commission are for the most part hostile with a few exceptions where the reason for the support is very apparent. Some want the act repealed, others want the power of the commission curtailed as to the elimination of competition and a number of revisions which to a great degree hamper a good commission in the work which should benefit the public. The Times believes that to repeal the late legislation in its extreme and would eventually work a greater hardship on the public owing to the inevitable combinations of public service corporations, in any one field or territory. But if the broad view which have ruled the action of the present commission is to be the standard, the people of the state have gained nothing and have lost instruments in building up a powerful ally for the corporations. Corporations have no souls and have a cold contempt generally for the public with which they must deal. This attitude has been the prime factor in the great animosity and distrust which has sprung up on the part of the public. Corporations will not do business at a loss for any length of time nor do they figure to furnish any article of

consumption to the French despised public, only so long as the public pays well for the service. For that reason any great anxiety for the welfare of the corporations is wasted. They are perfectly able to care for themselves. The idea that a public service corporation must be bailed and protected from extraneous expenditures is so much a wasted cry matter. The contention that if a fixed rate for service is made by a commission, necessitate equal protection against competition does not become attractive to the consumer who pays the bills, although commonly fair in the first aspect. There is no question but what the corporation with their array of local talent and their influence upon all legislative functions of the state are well cared for. The claim that competition will duplicate systems and eventually raise rates when the combination is effected depends altogether upon the honesty of the commission which makes rates about the same. It is not the corporation during a destructive rate war, Idaho surely needs greater electrical development. Twin Falls county needs electrical development and if that development is retarded or stopped altogether by the failure of the present company, then competition should be allowed. Let the corporations compete for market. That is what every other business is doing in its chosen field. There should, not be monopolies in public service unless owned and controlled by the people. Private gain for public service corporations is not the concern of the state. The state should protect only the consumer as to the rates charged until such time as the development of the state warrants clearer restrictions. That time is far distant in Idaho, where the corporations practically control the legislative functions and tie up natural resources by reason of the power given them.

The commission has seen the full length of its granted or usurped authority in preventing new electrical enterprises from operating in business in this state. It is just what the promoters of the public utilities law said would happen, but the general

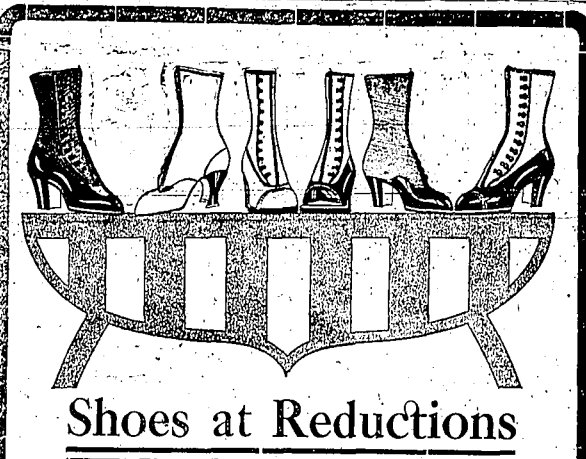

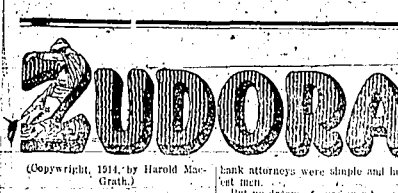
