



Consider Proposal of Having Wholesale Price Stamped on All Articles—Would Reveal War Profibeers

Washington, Sept. 16.—The was industries board is about to determine what fa. a fair profit for the tetailer.

Moved by the flood of complaints on proficering, the board has under consideration regulations to force the stamping of wholesale prices on all merchandise sold in the United States that the consumer may check the blood money makers individually. He will know when he inspects any article of merchandise just how much profit the retailer gets. This, members of the board believe, will be sufficient to stop most price boosting.

That tody's work will be to prevent stamping of prices above actual selling figures. It will protect the wholesalers and the manufacturers who attempt to undertake resales maintenance. The war industries board believes it can enforce such a program through its power of industrial classification and its hold on materials and trunsportation.

After having selected a pair at \$3.00, she remarked that the price was only 35 cents more than she had paid for the same kind of shoe here last year. Surely that was not profiteering on my part.

Another lady purchased a pair of infants' shoes one day recently, at 55 cents, and was surprised to find that they were only ten cents more than she had paid for the same kind of a shoe some time-ago.

A man with his wife and three thildren came in the store one day recently, having driven from their home sixteen miles away to buy a bill of goods here.
